

When Wishes Need to Surrender to Realities

I know some of you are fans of the **Louise Penny** series of novels about **Chief Inspector Armand Gamache** of Quebec. In most of the novels (just in case we may have forgotten!), Armand reminds us that to be a good leader, and, really to be a good human being, you have to be able to say four things. Over and over again, you have to be able to say:

- ✤ I was wrong.
- ✤ I need help.
- ✤ I'm sorry.
- ✤ I don't know.

Over the centuries, wise people have said we can avoid a great amount of suffering if we face the realities in front of us instead of ignoring them because they keep us from doing what we really wish we could do. I quote from the gospel of Gamache this week because the bold wishes I expressed in last week's **Reflections** about a live-streamed Good Friday evening service and drive-through doughnuts and blessings grew out of some of our deeply-held wishes – instead of being rooted in the *realities* that we face as people who have been told to stay at home so the spread of this pandemic can be reduced.

So there will **not** be a livestreamed Good Friday evening service with our friends at Christ United Methodist. Instead, we will ask the four Christ members and the three Redeemer members who have a word to share about seven places connected to Jesus' walk to the cross to video themselves, and have those individual reflections woven together into a service. We hope this can be ready for Friday night. We still need one more Redeemer person to offer a 3-5 minute reflection on the second station of the cross: "Jesus carries His cross," based on John 19:17. Please let me know if you can do this.

However, **Pastor Curnell Graham** from Christ United Methodist Church and I will lead a 20-minute live-stream prayer service at **noon on Good Friday** that will be broadcast over Christ UMC's Facebook page. So just go to that, and you can find the service.

The Executive Team of this congregation decided on Friday that we cannot be faithful to public health by telling those creating our weekly online worship that they have to leave home and gather in the sanctuary, even if they stay apart from each other. And we decided we cannot ask you all to drive to the church on Easter afternoon for doughnuts and a blessing. These ways of doing things send exactly the wrong messages to you about the need to stay at home. Again, we just wanted to keep bringing you worship in the simplest way possible. And we just wanted to make Easter special. We wanted to give you a chance to see each other, even through a car window; we wanted to do something playful with the doughnuts – and to hear what you want prayer around these days, and pray that prayer with you. All because we wished to offer a tangible sign of our love for you and for each other.

Regarding LSS/Food Collective Food Giveaways

The following letter was received from **Jon Disbro**, who coordinates Redeemer's efforts with the monthly Lutheran Social Services (LSS) and Mid-Ohio Food Collective (MOFC) giveaways:

"We are fast approaching the season of our LSS/MOFC Food Giveaway events. We are scheduled for the fourth Thursday of very month from April to October so that means our first event is scheduled in less than three weeks on <u>April 23</u>! As you can imagine, the demand for food assistance is surging and may only increase over the next few months so this ministry effort we share with LSS and the Mid-Ohio Food Collective is even more important.

"LSS has issued some new guidelines in an attempt to keep everyone, customers and volunteers, safe during the events and is basically asking us to convert to a drive-thru process where customers stay in their cars and we follow all of the physical distancing, hand washing, glove and face mask guidelines.

"With these important safety issues in mind, we realize that not everyone who wants to help will be able to help and we certainly want you to be safe and comfortable.

"In an effort to gauge our volunteer staffing for these events, and especially the one on April 23, we'd like for those who are willing to help to please email or call the church office to let us know.

"Some of the volunteer tasks will be much like in past years with some new twists to accommodate the new guidelines within our process.

I know our congregational efforts to combat food insecurity in our communities is very meaningful for many of us and our outreach means so much to those we serve."

Redeemer Member Chad Eberle writes: "As many of you know, running the New York City Marathon has long been a dream of mine. Despite entering the lottery for a ninth year, I did not get selected in the random drawing. So I have chosen to run this year for charity, and I am proud and pleased to be running as a member of Fred's Team, formed to honor **Fred Lebow**, a co-founder of the NYC marathon and a man who envisioned a world without cancer. I have chosen to specifically raise funds for Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center's Leukemia Fund.

"Greetings from Berkeley! I hope everyone is doing ok during this time of physically distancing from one another. Things out here at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary have been quite different, but we are all rising up to the challenge as we come up with new creative ways to connect with one another and worship together. My seminary has moved classes online for the rest of the semester and my commencement ceremony is cancelled. But I'm grateful for some of the nice weather we've had that has allowed us all to still walk and be outside (six feet apart of course) during our shelter-in-place order. I hope Columbus weather lets you do the same.

"Before the shelter-in-place order started here on March 17 in my county, I was busy with my classes, my participation in our student association executive committee, working as a graduate assistant to our Lutheran Theology professor, and working at my Ministry in Context site. This semester I was an MIC student with a faith-based nonprofit organization called San Francisco Night Ministry, which provides spiritual care and referral services to people living on the streets. SF Night Ministry has a variety of multi-faith services and has night ministers who walk the streets every night to provide services to the most vulnerable in the city, and have been doing so for over 50 years. My role had me helping lead an open air bilingual Eucharist service at a downtown BART. It was a really great experience helping lead the service in Spanish and worshiping alongside people I don't normally get to be in fellowship with.



"I also wanted to share some good news I found out this week. After I finish classes at the end of May, I will begin internship around August at Our Redeemer Church in Garden Grove, CA, in the LA area. I'm really looking forward to working with and learning from this other Redeemer congregation :)

All faithful wishes. But wishes that cannot be reconciled with an order to stay at home.

So, for not having allowed the realities we face to temper how I wish to see all of you and help you feel loved and held and accompanied in these days, I say "I am sorry" and "I was wrong." We WILL still have the Zoom gathering on Maundy Thursday. Any of you who wish to join us as we imagine being at the last supper the earthly Jesus has with his disciples, simply do the following:

- 1) Download Zoom onto your computer ideally so you can see everyone else.
- 2) Just before 7 p.m. on Thursday, April 9, click the Zoom icon on your computer twice and click the icon saying you want to join a meeting.
- 3) You'll be asked for your name, a meeting ID, and a password (the password is now required to avoid some to the Zoom security problems you may have heard about recently). The meeting ID is 190 416 153; the password is 001276.
- You'll be asked if you want to enter with video if you want us to be able to see you, click that. That should be all you need to join us for this time together.

If your computer doesn't have both video and audio, you can phone in to the meeting. We won't be able to see you, but you can still hear and you can speak. That phone number is 646-876-9923. After calling in, you'll still need to enter the Meeting ID and password above. Call my cell (206-725-3785) if you have any questions or problems connecting with this meeting.

As we move forward seeking to offer ways to feel that connection and joy that Redeemer is rooted in, **I need help** in being creative and playful while also not trying to do an end-run around reality! Because **I don't know** all the ways we might imagine being church in the days and weeks ahead.

Synod Cancels 2020 Synod Assembly

Bishop Suzanne Dillahunt of the Southern Ohio Synod announced that the Synod Council has decided to cancel the 2020 Synod Assembly. The synod's constitution allows for an every-other-year assembly schedule and for the Synod Council to make decisions between our assembly gatherings. So, on **Saturday, April 25**, the Synod Council will gather via the Internet, to carry out the work of the synod, including the approval of the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year budget, audit report, and to appoint individuals from to fill vacancies on the council. All open positions that were to be filled by way of election this year, will be on the agenda for the 2021 Synod Assembly. Those who are appointed will do so for a one-year term



only. She went on to note that registration fees will be refunded. In addition, an assembly report will be shared through the website and e-bulletin the first week in June.

The 2021 Southern Ohio Synod Assembly is set for <u>June 4-5</u> at Nationwide Conference Center in Lewis Center, Ohio.
