The Facts of Life

When you find yourself facing challenging times, where do you turn for some ideas about fresh ways to make it through?

Sometimes I go to familiar sources. More recently, I have turned to writings from non-Christians to discover how they talk about not letting life overwhelm you. In the Buddhist nun, **Pema Chodron**, I have found a deeply wise guide. In my morning prayer time now, I'm going through her book *The Places That Scare You* for the third time.

I offer a few of her ideas that I have found great gifts in these increasingly uncertain days.

She begins the book this way: When I was six years old I received [an] essential ... teaching from an old woman sitting in the sun. I was walking by her house one day feeling lonely, unloved, and mad, kicking anything I could find. Laughing, she said to me, "Little girl, don't you go letting life harden your heart." Right there, I received [great wisdom]: we can let the circumstances of our lives harden us so that we become increasingly resentful and afraid or we can let them soften us and make us kinder and more open to what scares us. We always have this choice."

Openness to whatever comes up inside us or outside us: Not judging it. Not labeling it. Not putting it into categories. Not running away from it. Simply noticing it and seeing where it might take you. Not using it to criticize yourself or anyone else. Not letting it shut you down or close you off from life. Not clinging to it or hiding from it. Just seeing it and feeling it. And then letting go of it.

By itself that is the work of a lifetime. And it's fine if it takes a lifetime. Because this isn't about achieving something or fixing something. It's not about racing someone to an enlightenment finish line. It's about opening ourselves to accepting ourselves just as we are. Which can then open us to accept others just as they are. It's about developing the quality Tibetan Buddhists call *maitri*: a complete acceptance of ourselves as we are, a simple, direct relationship with the way we are. No judgment, no criticism, no *I wish* or *I should*.

Being aware of this shows me how quickly and easily I find fault with myself. And how quickly and easily I find fault with others, which is a convenient way for me to get a break from criticizing myself!

Just one other idea of hers that works my maitri muscles: separate the story from the feeling. Say you feel resentful about something. That feeling leads to a story ... a story of someone who disappointed you, a story of someone who you think was treated better than you or got more opportunities. She encourages us to let the story drop. The story only sucks us down into some kind of judgment (again!), instead of letting us just notice the feeling and then let it pass through.

I tell myself not to be so critical of myself or someone else. And then a minute later I'm doing exactly what I'd said I wouldn't. And Chodron would say, "Of course that's happening. You've spent a lifetime doing it. You will spend a lifetime undoing it. So be gentle. Notice the judging coming right after you said you weren't going to do that anymore! And let yourself laugh about believing you could change immediately.

These times are all about being gentle with ourselves, laughing at ourselves, falling down and getting back up again. Our world needs kindness and bravery. I find Pema Chodron's words a deeply kind and courageous invitation to such a way of being in the world. I'd love to discuss any of these ideas with any of you if you'd like! Just let me know.

It's a book which **Martin Luther** believed it totally contradicted the teachings of Paul which had been so essential for Luther's own transformation and which he felt formed the essence of grace. It was one of the last books accepted into the collection that became the New Testament partly because it seemed to differ from Paul's writings. The main reason was because it wasn't clear that it was written by someone who had known or met **Jesus**, so its "apostolic origins" were in doubt. At the same time, James has some of the clearest statements about what love and justice look like in action that exist in any of scripture.

We are a group of people who are both serious about listening for the Spirit's voice in the text and in each other and serious about supporting each other through whatever we're going through -- and who laugh deeply and often. - **Aug. 7** Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathered for the Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly and participating in online sessions, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.
- **Aug. 8** Pray for the Spirit to stir within us humility, wisdom, empathy and a commitment to dismantle the barriers between people who live in wealth and people who live in poverty. Pray that all will have sufficient resources for daily life and self-sufficiency but also will develop a deeper commitment to mutual care and will value one another and our interdependence.
- **Aug. 9** Just as Jesus calmed and reassured his disciples in a boat crossing a stormy sea, we pray for protection, comfort and renewal of faith in these difficult, uncertain times and in future ordeals.
