## **LDR Assists Victims of Wildfires, Hurricane**

Lutheran Disaster Relief (LDR) is seeking assistance as it works to help those affected by Hurricane Laura and the wildfires in California.

According to LDR, Hurricane Laura, a powerful Category 4 storm, hit Louisiana and parts of Texas with devastating force, causing a number of deaths, major damage and leaving hundreds of thousands without power. With extremely dangerous storm surge and winds of at least 150 mph, it's one of the most powerful storms to hit the area in a century, and it left widespread destruction in its wake. Given the complexities caused by COVID-19, sheltering those impacted will be a challenge.

"Lutheran Disaster Response is working with Lutheran Social Services Disaster Response (Upbring) and the Northern Texas-Northern Louisiana, Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast and Southwestern Texas synods, which are assessing the immediate needs and initiating a response. While the extent of the damage is not yet known, we will accompany devastated communities from immediate relief through long-term recovery. This is an important part of Christ's call to our church.

"Together, we can help provide immediate and long-lasting support for those whose lives have been impacted by hurricanes. Please join me in prayer and partnership, and stay connected to the latest events and our response to this and other disasters through our Facebook page" which can be found at <a href="https://www.facebook.com/ELCALDR/">https://www.facebook.com/ELCALDR/</a>.

Meanwhile, LDR continues to assist those affected by the California wildfires. "Fueled by a heat wave and ignited by lightning strikes, some of the worst wildfires in California's history have erupted across the state. At least four people have died, tens of thousands of people are under evacuation orders, over 1 million acres have burned, and more than 1,000 structures have been destroyed and thousands more are threatened. Some evacuees face the difficult decision of whether to stay in a shelter during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Lutheran Disaster Response is engaging with Lutheran Social Services of Southern California and Lutheran Social Services of Northern California, along with the three California synods (Sierra Pacific, Southwest California and Pacifica), to assess the situation and determine the best ways to respond. We expect immediate needs to include food and other life necessities, as well as emotional and spiritual care for those who have been traumatized. Long-term recovery assistance may include rebuilding and repairing homes."

Thank you for your continued support in helping feed those in need. A Sloppy Joe recipe from **Kathy Mimlitch** is as follows:

2 lbs lean ground beef (or ground turkey)

1/2 cup chopped onion

1/2 cup chopped green pepper

1 tsp garlic powder

2 tsp prepared yellow mustard

1 1/2 cups ketchup

6 tsp brown sugar

Salt and pepper to taste

In a medium skillet over medium heat, brown the ground beef, onion and green pepper. Drain off liquids. Stir in garlic powder, mustard, ketchup and brown sugar. Mix thoroughly. Reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. This makes 12 servings.

The green pepper can be omitted while the ketchup can also be mixed with barbecue sauce. The brown sugar can be almost doubled for a sweeter batch.

# ELCA Explores Martin Luther's *Freedom of a Christian* on 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

The ELCA recently invited Lutherans to study and reflect on **Martin Luther's** "The Freedom of a Christian" on the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its writing. This is an invitation to hear, share and experience the Lutheran witness of the Christian faith as it relates to God's narrative of freedom in Christ.

To this end, the ELCA has made both an annotated version of the statement available as well as a study guide. Both can be found at <a href="https://tinyurl.com/yyryzcba">https://tinyurl.com/yyryzcba</a>.

Of this effort, **Bishop Elizabeth Eaton** writes, "We are living in uncertain and difficult times. Amid the pandemic of COVID-19 and the ongoing pandemic of racism and xenophobia, our communities and world are ravaged by illness, death and injustice. Fear, grief, anger and strife are within and around us. We are tempted to turn inward in despair.

"Five hundred years ago, Martin Luther wrote a treatise titled The Freedom of a Christian. In it, he offered his most compelling summary of the Christian life: In Christ we are completely free and at the same time completely bound in love and service to our neighbors. For Christians such as you and me, this has been our Lutheran way of telling the Christian story for 500 years. At the heart of our Lutheran theological tradition, we find the antidote to our despair.

"In this treatise, Luther describes a 'happy exchange' wherein Christ sets us free by taking upon himself humankind's sin, pain and judgment, and in return giving us his liberating life. In that exchange, we are free from the clutches of sin, from the forces that try to tear us apart and from any condemnation. We are empowered in turn to use our freedom to serve our neighbors, whoever they may be. This message remains timely when voices that marginalize certain people, or preach contempt, hatred and violence, dominate our public discourse. How do we hear and trust this word from God today, and continue to serve God's life-giving work?

"I invite you to read, study and reflect on The Freedom of Christian using this study guide, ably written by the **Rev. Dr. Carmelo Santos**, director for theological diversity and ecumenical and interreligious engagement, in consultation with others. As you engage with this 500-year-old text, a series of case studies he has curated at ELCA500.org will help you to encounter the diversity of voices that represent the vitality of the Lutheran movement today.

"Luther wrote, 'Christian individuals do not live in themselves but in Christ and their neighbor.' Today, as in Luther's day, our faithful response to the uncertainty and death-dealing forces in our world is to proclaim that which is sure and life-giving for all. Freed in Christ, we resist the temptation to turn

inward in despair by turning outward in love and service to the world. Siblings in Christ, rejoice! We are no longer captive, but free."
