The Holy Gospel according to Matthew **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus sat on the Mount of Olives, and said to his disciples, “The kingdom of heaven could be likened to ten attendants who took their lamps and went to meet the bridal party. Five of them were wise, five were foolish. When the foolish ones took their lamps, they didn’t take any oil with them, but the wise ones took enough oil to keep their lamps burning. The Lord be with you.


Lift up your hearts.



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


Thanks from the Stewardship Team to all who have returned their response cards, which were dedicated during worship services on Reformation Sunday.
