Renewing, Repairing and Restoring: our commitments to God, to one another and to all of creation

Editor's Note: Over the last several weeks, **Reflections** has reported on the "Season of Creation" devotions offered by church leaders of four denominations including the ELCA's **Bishop Elizabeth Eaton.** Below is her devotion:

The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul Psalm 19:7

In the story of creation God provided a paradise. All of creation was in balance and was a delight. And God set clear boundaries so that balance could be maintained and all created things could flourish. These boundaries provided definition that made possible the amazing diversity of the created world. Far from being a constraint, these boundaries provided freedom and, paradoxically, real connection.

But humankind rebelled and continues to rebel. It is almost as if we view boundaries as an offense and limits as an affront. Creation is ours to use! But that denies the truth that we have this one earth and this one temporal life.

As I write this, we are living in a pandemic. The coronavirus that causes COVID-19 has spread throughout the world, bringing sickness and death. Viruses are strange creatures. They have no nucleus or membrane; they are unable to differentiate like normal healthy cells and are completely dependent on a host cell to survive. They will use up that cell even if it means the death of the host.

So God, through the law, gave us the gift of limits. God is God and we are not. We are responsible to each other. Our actions have consequences. We are not to live as membrane-less viruses.

The law of the Lord is perfect, sure, right, clear, pure and true. It brings wisdom, rejoicing, enlightenment and righteousness.

Creator God, help us to accept your boundaries so that all created things can flourish. Amen.

ELCA Provides Guidance on Political Activity for Churches, Leaders

With election season in full swing, **ELCA General Counsel Tom Cunniff** asked the Southern Ohio Synod to share the following reminders regarding what churches and church leaders can and cannot do in regard to political activity. Highlights of the materials are the following:

- Congregations cannot support or endorse candidates for office, but can do issue advocacy and neutral political activity (non-partisan registration drives, being a polling place, etc.)
- Pastors and other church employees can endorse or support candidates, but only if it is clear that they are acting in their personal capacity and not in their capacity as a leader or employee of the congregation (pastor cannot endorse from the pulpit, for example).

Survey to Assess Pastoral Needs for Ministry in Multireligious World

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is conducting a survey to collect the experiences and needs of the church for ministry in a multireligious world. The survey is a first step in the development of guidelines for the church as outlined in *A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment: A policy statement of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*, adopted by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly and which can be found online at https://tinyurl.com/y4xax7pq. The declaration reflects the longtime inter-religious commitments of the church.

The policy statement acknowledged that "there are many pastoral considerations beyond the scope of this declaration, for example, the common reality of multireligious family life. Therefore, the church recognizes the need for the ongoing development of appropriate pastoral aids, including guidelines for inter-religious marriages, pastoral counseling, religious education, and joint prayer services." Recently, **ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton** appointed an ad hoc committee to undertake the development of such guidelines.

In the survey, issued September 12, respondents are asked questions about their participation in pastoral situations such as inter-religious prayer services, responses to tragedy, social ministry work with partners, and pastoral care for inter-religious couples and families.

"In these challenging times of COVID-19, racism and injustice, our inter-religious partnerships have been as important as ever," Eaton said. "As we seek to live out our inter-religious commitments, all of us are encountering new areas of pastoral need. Participation in this survey will help us to grow as we serve Christ's church together in a multireligious world."

One version of the survey will be emailed directly to active rostered ministers. Another version is available online for participation from ELCA laity, retired rostered minsters, and ecumenical and interreligious partners. The intention of the survey is to learn from all who participate in ELCA ministries in a multireligious world what their experiences have been, and what guidance and resources they need for the future. The survey will be open for one month, from **September 12-October 12**.

Boards of Elections Accepting Applications for Absentee Ballots; Local Issues on Ballot

Boards of elections are currently accepting applications for absentee ballots for the November 3 election. Persons requesting absentee ballots must remember that this, for the most part, ties them to voting either by mailing in the ballot or dropping it off at the dropbox at the board of elections. If a person who has requested an absentee ballot decides to vote in person, they will vote a provisional ballot so the board so can verify that they only submitted one ballot.

The absentee ballot request form can be found online at https://www.ohiosos.gov/elections/voters/absentee-ballot/. Follow the directions on this secretary of state's website. The application must be downloaded, signed and mailed to your local board of elections. (A link to find the address for all boards of elections is also on this page.)

Another option is to call your local board of election and request the ballot application. Phone numbers for the local boards can also be found at the above link.

For those who don't want to vote by mail, beginning <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>October 6</u>, individuals can vote in person at the board of elections. For Franklin County, that address is 1700 Morse Rd.

The following is a roundup of important voting dates leading up to and after the $\underline{\text{Tuesday}}$, $\underline{\text{November 3}}$ General Election.

Monday, October 5 - Deadline for **voter registration** for the Nov. 3, 2020 General Election (30 days before the General Election).

Tuesday, October 6 - First day voters can **cast absentee ballots** for the November 3 General Election -- first day after close of voter registration. First day boards of elections can begin mailing absentee ballots to voters.

Saturday, October 31 - Applications for absentee ballots to be mailed for the November 3, 2020 must be received by boards of elections by noon -- three days before the General Election.

Monday, November 2 - Absentee ballots sent using the U.S. Postal Service must be postmarked by this date in order to count.

Tuesday, November 3 - General Election Day. Polls open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Ballot Issues

Besides the city of Columbus ballot issue creating the independent civilian police review board (Issue #2) which is addressed on the front page of this *Reflections*, there is also on the ballot a second city issue proposing the creation of an electric service aggregation program (Issue #1). A countywide issue, Issue #24, renews and increases the tax levy for mental health, alcohol and drug addiction programs for children, adults and families including residential and outpatient treatment programs, school and community based prevention programs and patient housing.
