## Regathering for Worship **OUTSIDE** on Sept. 27! RSVP If You're Coming!

March 8 was the last time we did what we'd always done without even thinking about it. Twenty-seven weeks have passed since then. So much of how we live and work and play has stopped. Depending on what our life circumstances are, we have had to reimagine a few things or we've had to reimagine everything. Work, schooling, how to show our love to people in hospitals and assisted-living or nursing facilities; canceled travel plans and canceled events we've counted on for entertainment, community, volunteering, and other kinds of meaningful involvement.

And worshipping by looking at a screen.

A number of people have worked so hard to keep worship alive during this time. We can never thank our worship leaders, and especially our virtual worship producers **Michele Disbro**, **Kristi Hildebrand** and **Tom Mimplitch**, enough for creating these services and bringing them to us.

Speaking for myself, I never expected it to last this long.

So I am more than thrilled to make sure you heard the news this week's all-church mailing announced: We will gather in-person for an outside worship service on the church lawn on **Sunday, September 27** at 10 am! Twenty-eight weeks after we last met in-person, those of us who feel safe to do so will actually be in the same place at the same time again. What a gift.

If you didn't receive the letter describing all the details about what to expect and what we're requiring of you to attend that service, please contact the church office so we can get that to you.

I won't repeat everything in that letter. On behalf of the Safe Regathering Team, I want to stress how important it is for you to read that letter carefully so nothing surprises you about what we need from you and about some of the changes we've had to make in this service for all of us to be safe.

**One essential piece of information that wasn't in the document you received:** If you plan to come to the service, please RSVP to the church office with your name and the number of people in your party. We estimate that we can have about 50 people on the lawn together safely. We don't want you to show up and not have room for you! So let us know of your plans to come.

Above all we want you to be safe, and to make the decision about coming that is right for you. We will continue to record the service so you will have that available if you don't come in-person.

We are a resilient, faithful community of Jesus' followers. Thank you for continuing to support each other and the ministries that express our commitment to fostering understanding and healing in community.

### RLC's Anti-Racism Group to Zoom with Reps from BREAD

The on-going national attention to issues of racism and healing is leading Redeemer's anti-racism group to have conversations with people in the area who have committed themselves to trying to take concrete steps toward changing systems and attitudes to transform the system of racism step by step. On **Wednesday, September 23**, the anti-racism group will host **Rob Sievert Wagner** and **Quay Barnes** on Zoom.

Wagner works for BREAD -- Building Responsibility, Equality, and Dignity. This is a national organization that brings people of different faith communities together to work on justice issues. Recently, BREAD congregations have succeeded in getting Franklin County to increase funding for affordable housing, in expanding services for those living with mental illness, working with the Columbus School Board to train staff in disciplinary techniques that reduce the use of suspensions so young people can stay in school, and securing the creation of more jobs in traditionally underserved and under-resourced communities. Wagner will talk about what BREAD is doing now. Barnes, a member of Christ United Methodist Church and a community leader, will talk about what her congregation has done with BREAD and some ways people in local congregations can feel like they're putting their faith into action for justice.

## Council Reports on Finance Changes

**Larry Trover** has dedicated many, many hours these past years to the church's finances, and has been serving as Redeemer's treasurer in recent years. He had let leadership know late last year that he wanted a break. **Brad Phillips** had also asked that this be his last year as financial secretary. As you may remember we were never able to recruit someone to act as finance officer this year. Early in the year (pre-pandemic!) council had approved a motion to contract with **Donald Wells**, CPA, to analyze our systems for payroll, cash disbursements and cash receipts and make recommendations for financial policies. This sort of analysis was also recommended in last year's audit.

Then Larry got COVID-19, and suddenly the only person who knew the system for writing checks was (and is) unable to do that job. Council has been kept up to date on Donald Wells' work (which was completed), and the possibility that we would recommend in next year's budget that we transition to his firm doing part or most of our bookkeeping with appropriate sign off by officers on payments through online banking. Given Larry's health and a long road to recovery, and his wish to stop at the end of the year, council voted to begin the transition now.

The cost for Donald Wells services is very reasonable and it is more and more difficult to recruit three people for these financial positions. We recognize that it will take time to work with this transition, and we regret that we were not able to meet together to discuss this topic with the congregation. But the pandemic forced our hand and we were lucky that the analysis was complete and a transition was on council's radar.

Our heartfelt thanks to Larry, who spent considerable time with Donald Wells during the analysis, and to Brad Phillips for his input as well. During the transition which will likely become active after October 1, **Julie Johnson**, vice president, will fill Larry's responsibilities and therefore will not sign contracts or checks during the transition.

## 2020 CROP Walk Goes Virtual

This year's CROP Walk for alleviating hunger will be on **Sunday, October 11**. The walk will be a virtual one because of coronavirus restrictions. Redeemer walkers will do their walks around their own neighborhoods instead of in a group at Scioto Audubon Metro Park as in previous years.

### As Wildfires Rage, LDR Continues to Help, Need Help

Imagine you're home and you hear a knock at the door. An official tells you to pack your essentials and evacuate, as a wildfire is speeding toward you. This is the situation many of our neighbors in the western part of the country are facing right now.

Fueled by a heat wave and unfavorable winds, devastating wildfires are raging across California, Oregon, Washington and other western states. At least 20 people have died, hundreds of thousands of people are under evacuation orders and more than 3.5 million acres have burned across the three states. Some evacuees face the difficult decision of whether to stay in a shelter during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is engaging with at least three Lutheran social services agencies and five synods to assess the situation and determine the best ways to respond. We expect immediate needs may include food and other necessities, as well as emotional and spiritual care for those who have been traumatized.

“Your gifts will support wildfire survivors. Gifts to "U.S. wildfires" will be used in full (100 percent) to assist those affected by wildfires until the response is complete. Contributions can be made online at <https://tinyurl.com/y5uxywfl> .

### 'Season of Creation' Devotions Offered by Church Leaders

**ELCA Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton** and leaders from The Episcopal Church, the Anglican Church of Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada have prepared a series of devotions to observe the Season of Creation 2020, which is running now through **Sunday, October 4**.

According to Eaton, “The season ... is a time to join with the global Christian community in renewing, repairing and restoring commitments to God, to one another and to all of creation. For the four churches, it is also a time for strengthening relationships with one another. Through Scripture, hymns, advocacy and action, the weekly devotions, which began September 6, invite people to live out their vocation as stewards of creation.

“We pray that our actions as stewards of God's good creation will continue to deepen not only in this season, but for all time,” Eaton added. “Even as our relations as churches are not bound by national or ecclesiastical borders, neither is our witness to the One who came to redeem all of creation.”

In addition to Eaton, the devotions were contributed by the **Most Rev. Michael B. Curry**, presiding bishop and primate, The Episcopal Church; the **Rev. Susan C. Johnson**, national bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada; and the **Most Rev. Linda Nicholls**, archbishop and primate of the Anglican Church of Canada.

“I pray that these reflections will open hearts and minds to experience our relationship in and with all of creation in new ways,” said Nicholls.

In the opening devotion, the leaders stress the significance of a collective responsibility in caring for creation. “Waking up to matters of climate justice and environmental stewardship are among the most important callings people have today. Over many years, through many voices, our churches have come to a growing conviction that loving our neighbor includes loving Mother Earth as a neighbor.”

“It is timely, relevant and exciting for our churches to join together in prayer, worship and reflection during the Season of Creation,” said Johnson. “With open hearts, minds and souls may we discern new actions and practices to show love for God’s creation.”

“In this season of activism as we seek God’s liberating, life-giving love for all, may these prayers and devotions inspire us to care for a world in which all creation can flourish,” said Curry.

The relations among the four churches have moved more closely toward “mutual recognition,” bringing into mutual relation the two churches of “Called to Common Mission” in the United States and those of the Waterloo Declaration in Canada. One notable feature of the agreement is that it cites the experience of Indigenous people “not divided by national borders established by colonialist power” as grounds for expanding shared life among the churches. A Memorandum of Mutual Recognition (MMR) was approved by both Canadian churches in July 2019. The 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly adopted constitutional changes embracing the Anglican Church of Canada, and in November 2019 the Church Council adopted the MMR. Once The Episcopal Church acts, the mutual recognition of the four churches will come into full effect.

## Survey to Assess Pastoral Needs for Ministry in Multireligious World

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is conducting a survey to collect the experiences and needs of the church for ministry in a multireligious world. The survey is a first step in the development of guidelines for the church as outlined in *A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment: A policy statement of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*, adopted by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly and which can be found online at <https://tinyurl.com/y4xax7pq>. The declaration reflects the longtime inter-religious commitments of the church.

The policy statement acknowledged that “there are many pastoral considerations beyond the scope of this declaration, for example, the common reality of multireligious family life. Therefore, the church recognizes the need for the ongoing development of appropriate pastoral aids, including guidelines for inter-religious marriages, pastoral counseling, religious education, and joint prayer services.” Recently, **ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton** appointed an ad hoc committee to undertake the development of such guidelines.

In the survey, issued September 12, respondents are asked questions about their participation in pastoral situations such as inter-religious prayer services, responses to tragedy, social ministry work with partners, and pastoral care for inter-religious couples and families.

“In these challenging times of COVID-19, racism and injustice, our inter-religious partnerships have been as important as ever,” Eaton said. “As we seek to live out our inter-religious commitments, all of us are encountering new areas of pastoral need. Participation in this survey will help us to grow as we serve Christ’s church together in a multireligious world.”

One version of the survey will be emailed directly to active rostered ministers. Another version is available online for participation from ELCA laity, retired rostered ministers, and ecumenical and inter-religious partners. The intention of the survey is to learn from all who participate in ELCA ministries in a multireligious world what their experiences have been, and what guidance and resources they need for the future. The survey will be open for one month, from **September 12-October 12**.
