### **GATHER US IN!!**

Gather us in, all peoples together, fire of love in our flesh and our bone.

When **Marty Haugen** wrote these words almost 40 years ago, there's no way he could have known what a joyful noise they would make in the ears of a congregation whose members haven't been able to be "gathered in" for more than six months. And now the waiting is over. And all of us who decide we can gather safely for an outside service of worship will do so *this Sunday* at 10 a.m. on the Redeemer lawn.

And what a beautiful community of the gathered-in we will be!

Hopefully you've received the material put together by the Safe Re-gathering Team that explains what we need from you and how we are trying to make this as safe and enjoyable a morning as we can. This group worked and worked to imagine and implement the plan you've been sent. After this Sunday, we will take a week or two to listen to you share your experiences, and your ideas about adjustments we might make for future Sundays. I cannot thank them enough – as I continue to be unable sufficiently to thank the producers who have videoed worship for the past six months, and the worship leaders who never imagined they'd have to do what they've done to make worship happen.

If you feel like you want to re-gather with us on Sunday, here's a reminder of what to expect:

- O Please bring a chair for each person in your party; we will have some chairs if you're unable to bring your own.
- o Arrive at the church *no earlier than* 9:45. Please don't gather outside your car.
- A banner indicates the "entrance" to worship. There you will be welcomed, asked a few questions, and then your temperature will be taken. If everyone in your party is healthy, you'll be asked if you'd like to have an usher take you to where you will put your chairs. If you do this, you will then return to the entrance area for hand-sanitizer, bulletin, and your communion packet (and box of raisins for the younger among us). If you wish to wait to be seated until after you've done these things, an usher will seat you then. The communion packet has a tiny cup of grape juice. The communion wafer is inside the foil-wrapped lid of the cup. It's easy to miss that! Bulletins will be emailed before worship, so you can follow the bulletin on your phone and avoid a paper copy.
- O You'll be seated with your party; if you are on your own, you will be seated at least six feet from any other person/group.
- If you have difficulties walking on uneven ground and decide to come to worship, please be sure to bring a cane or walker.
- Emily Kent will sing the hymns, serve as cantor for the sung psalm, and also offer a solo. Karen Kent will lead the instrumental music. It will be very hard not to join in. But the best science we know right now tells us not to sing together. So allow these two gifted musicians to be our songs of praise.
- O After the service, again, we ask you not to gather close to each other. There will be a banner indicating the exit. Throw away the communion cup and foil wrap and, if you don't want to keep it, put your bulletin in the blue recycling container.

It will be a drive-through giveaway that was implemented in April. Some volunteers will meet at 1 p.m. to set-up while others are asked to arrive by 2 p.m. to bag the food.

Difficult times continue for many people. Currently Redeemer Lutheran Church participates in a garden giveaway on Saturdays and a monthly food giveaway in cooperation with MidOhio Food Cooperative.

For the next four months, two of the Free Little Libraries will be converted into "blessing boxes" One box will hold canned goods such as soups, canned meats, boxed meals. The other box will hold personal care products and paper goods such as tissues.

### RLC's Anti-Racism Group to Zoom with Reps from BREAD

The on-going national attention to issues of racism and healing is leading Redeemer's anti-racism group to have conversations with people in the area who have committed themselves to trying to take concrete steps toward changing systems and attitudes to transform the system of racism step by step. On

<u>Wednesday, September 23</u>, the anti-racism group will host **Rob Sievert Wagner** and **Quay Barnes** on Zoom.

Wagner works for BREAD -- Building Responsibility, Equality, and Dignity. This is a national organization that brings people of different faith communities together to work on justice issues. Recently, BREAD congregations have succeeded in getting Franklin County to increase funding for affordable housing, in expanding services for those living with mental illness, working with the Columbus School Board to train staff in disciplinary techniques that reduce the use of suspensions so young people can stay in school, and securing the creation of more jobs in traditionally underserved and under-resourced communities. Wagner will talk about what BREAD is doing now. Barnes, a member of Christ United Methodist Church and a community leader, will talk about what her congregation has done with BREAD and some ways people in local congregations can feel like they're putting their faith into action for justice.

## **Council Provides Further Finance Updates**

This continues to be a time of transition from having Redeemer's financial bookkeeping done by a treasurer (**Larry Trover** previously) and a financial secretary (**Brad Phillips**). Council reports, with thanksgiving, that giving has continued to be steady throughout this pandemic. While Brad continues his work, Larry has been granted his wish to end his time as treasurer and **Julie Johnson** is temporarily covering in his absence, pending the transition to the CPA firm.

Julie reported to council that to her knowledge all bills have been paid except for one month of benevolence, pending the receipt of additional information. Council asked that benevolence be paid on the best estimate with revisions (if any) made after the transition to the Wells CPA firm.

**Margie Frazier**, the point person for Donald Wells, CPA, reports he has obtained the necessary software (at sale price) and his staff have started to input data from Redeemer. They will also be able to input giving. Council asks for the congregation's patience during this transition, as we may not be able to report all the details that Larry has faithfully provided until after the transition has occurred.

"Be assured that in the meantime, tasks are being covered."

#### Sister Act Sets 'Mini Retreat' for Oct. 3

Sister Act has scheduled a "mini retreat" for <u>Saturday, October 3</u> at the home of <u>Sue Yehling</u>. It will begin at 11 a.m. and ending about 2 p.m. Those attending asked to wear a mask and to bring a lunch or snack, something to drink and a chair. Food and drinks will not be shared.

The day's events include three stations for gathering and greeting, a luncheon presentation on "What is your *Prakriti*?"

Prakriti is a Sanskrit word meaning "nature" and it refers to our predisposition. It's the true nature of our body and mind. Our prakriti is made up of a blend of three doshas. Understanding the make-up of your prakriti will help you recognize when you're "out of balance" and steps you can take to get back in balance.

**Michele Disbro,** who is leading the session, asks those attending to take the 10-minute online quiz prior to October 3. "Then, you will be given what percentage you are of the three doshas: *vata*, *pitta*, *and kapha*. **Please take the quiz and write down your results**.

"If life is crazy for you and you don't get a chance to take the quiz, no worries. You can still listen to the conversation and then, take the quiz later when you have time." She notes that attendees will then have some time to chat with others who have the same primary dosha as well as meet with others who have the other two primary doshas.

# As Wildfires Rage, LDR Continues to Help, Need Help

Imagine you're home and you hear a knock at the door. An official tells you to pack your essentials and evacuate, as a wildfire is speeding toward you. This is the situation many of our neighbors in the western part of the country are facing right now.

Fueled by a heat wave and unfavorable winds, devastating wildfires are raging across California, Oregon, Washington and other western states. At least 20 people have died, hundreds of thousands of people are under evacuation orders and more than 3.5 million acres have burned across the three states. Some evacuees face the difficult decision of whether to stay in a shelter during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is engaging with at least three Lutheran social services agencies and five synods to assess the situation and determine the best ways to respond. We expect immediate needs may include food and other necessities, as well as emotional and spiritual care for those who have been traumatized.

"Your gifts will support wildfire survivors. Gifts to "U.S. wildfires" will be used in full (100 percent) to assist those affected by wildfires until the response is complete. Contributions can be made online at <a href="https://tinyurl.com/y5uxywfl">https://tinyurl.com/y5uxywfl</a>.

#### **'Season of Creation' Devotions Offered by Church Leaders**

**ELCA Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton** and leaders from The Episcopal Church, the Anglican Church of Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada have prepared a series of devotions to observe the Season of Creation 2020, which is running now through **Sunday, October 4**.

According to Eaton, "The season ... is a time to join with the global Christian community in renewing, repairing and restoring commitments to God, to one another and to all of creation. For the four churches, it is also a time for strengthening relationships with one another. Through Scripture, hymns, advocacy and action, the weekly devotions, which began September 6, invite people to live out their vocation as stewards of creation.

"We pray that our actions as stewards of God's good creation will continue to deepen not only in this season, but for all time," Eaton added. "Even as our relations as churches are not bound by national or ecclesiastical borders, neither is our witness to the One who came to redeem all of creation."

In addition to Eaton, the devotions were contributed by the **Most Rev. Michael B. Curry**, presiding bishop and primate, The Episcopal Church; the **Rev. Susan C. Johnson**, national bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada; and the **Most Rev. Linda Nicholls**, archbishop and primate of the Anglican Church of Canada.

"I pray that these reflections will open hearts and minds to experience our relationship in and with all of creation in new ways," said Nicholls.

In the opening devotion, the leaders stress the significance of a collective responsibility in caring for creation. "Waking up to matters of climate justice and environmental stewardship are among the most important callings people have today. Over many years, through many voices, our churches have come to a growing conviction that loving our neighbor includes loving Mother Earth as a neighbor."

"It is timely, relevant and exciting for our churches to join together in prayer, worship and reflection during the Season of Creation," said Johnson. "With open hearts, minds and souls may we discern new actions and practices to show love for God's creation."

"In this season of activism as we seek God's liberating, life-giving love for all, may these prayers and devotions inspire us to care for a world in which all creation can flourish," said Curry.

The relations among the four churches have moved more closely toward "mutual recognition," bringing into mutual relation the two churches of "Called to Common Mission" in the United States and those of the Waterloo Declaration in Canada. One notable feature of the agreement is that it cites the

experience of Indigenous people "not divided by national borders established by colonialist power" as grounds for expanding shared life among the churches. A Memorandum of Mutual Recognition (MMR) was approved by both Canadian churches in July 2019. The 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly adopted constitutional changes embracing the Anglican Church of Canada, and in November 2019 the Church Council adopted the MMR. Once The Episcopal Church acts, the mutual recognition of the four churches will come into full effect.

### Survey to Assess Pastoral Needs for Ministry in Multireligious World

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is conducting a survey to collect the experiences and needs of the church for ministry in a multireligious world. The survey is a first step in the development of guidelines for the church as outlined in *A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment: A policy statement of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*, adopted by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly and which can be found online at <a href="https://tinyurl.com/y4xax7pq">https://tinyurl.com/y4xax7pq</a>. The declaration reflects the longtime inter-religious commitments of the church.

The policy statement acknowledged that "there are many pastoral considerations beyond the scope of this declaration, for example, the common reality of multireligious family life. Therefore, the church recognizes the need for the ongoing development of appropriate pastoral aids, including guidelines for inter-religious marriages, pastoral counseling, religious education, and joint prayer services." Recently, **ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton** appointed an ad hoc committee to undertake the development of such guidelines.

In the survey, issued September 12, respondents are asked questions about their participation in pastoral situations such as inter-religious prayer services, responses to tragedy, social ministry work with partners, and pastoral care for inter-religious couples and families.

"In these challenging times of COVID-19, racism and injustice, our inter-religious partnerships have been as important as ever," Eaton said. "As we seek to live out our inter-religious commitments, all of us are encountering new areas of pastoral need. Participation in this survey will help us to grow as we serve Christ's church together in a multireligious world."

One version of the survey will be emailed directly to active rostered ministers. Another version is available online for participation from ELCA laity, retired rostered ministers, and ecumenical and interreligious partners. The intention of the survey is to learn from all who participate in ELCA ministries in a multireligious world what their experiences have been, and what guidance and resources they need for the future. The survey will be open for one month, from **September 12-October 12**.
