Reaching across the Divide

The political divides in the United States already felt like they were practically unbridgeable. When we couldn't even come close to agreement on what was a "fact" and what was "fake news," we wondered what common ground we could find even to *begin* a conversation.

Then came the events of January 6. That's the feast day of the Epiphany, which celebrates when the Christ Child was revealed to non-Jews in the form of the Magi. But that day brought a different kind of "revealing": how far the president and some of his followers were willing to go to try to keep the new president- and vice-president-elect from assuming the offices to which a clear majority of the voters had elected them.

Whatever happens in the near-term after last Wednesday, it's fair to ask how any kind of healing and mutual understanding might begin. And whether it's even time to try to approach that.

A front-page article in yesterday's *Columbus Dispatch* invites any of us interested in trying this to join a group that has been doing it the past four years. "Braver Angels" and the "USA Today Network Ohio" are partnering to form groups of people who find themselves on very different sides of the political divide yet are committed to fostering understanding by listening deeply to each other and talking honestly with each other. One part of the story (https://tinyurl.com/y2o7q8kd) speaks of how the group helped a couple who had been married for years to stay together in spite of how challenging they found their shared lives after the 2016 presidential election.

There are small-group workshops and one-on-one conversation sessions available, depending on the kind of setting you prefer. The editor of the *Dispatch* said, "Our hope is that the discussions will help individuals and communities move forward together to accomplish our common hopes and dreams."

If you choose to participate in Braver Angels, please let me know! I'd love for us to share our experiences.

Italian Pasta Bake Recipe

2 lbs. ground beef

1 large onion, chopped

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 jar (24 ounces) spaghetti sauce

1 can (14 ½ ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained

1 can (4 ounces) mushrooms, drained (optional)

1 tsp. Italian seasoning

3 cups uncooked medium pasta shells

3 plum tomatoes, sliced

3/4 c shredded provolone cheese

3/4 c shredded mozzarella cheese

Directions

- In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until no longer pink. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Drain. Stir in spaghetti sauce, diced tomatoes, mushrooms and Italian seasoning. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 20 minutes.
- Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350°. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Add to beef mixture and gently stir in sliced plum tomatoes.
- Transfer to an ungreased 13x9-in. baking dish. Sprinkle with cheeses. Bake 25-30 minutes or until bubbly and heated through.

Registration for 2021 LOMO Camp Programs Opens Soon

Lutheran Outdoor Ministries of Ohio (LOMO) announced that registration for 2021 sponsored retreats and summer camp programs will open on <u>Saturday, January 23</u>. The complete schedule can be found online at https://www.lomocamps.org/calendar. The first of the retreats is the Family Spring Retreat at Lutheran Memorial Camp (LMC) on April 23-24. That is followed by Servant Weekends at Camp Luther and LMC in May.

Summer camp programs are scheduled to begin the week of June 13.

LOMO writes, "We have put many safety protocols in place to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19; these procedures are based on the CDC's Field Guide for camps. But, even with safety procedures, we cannot guarantee that COVID-19 will not be spread at camp. While we want everyone to experience the joy and blessings of camp participation we understand that you might choose not to attend camp if you are at high risk for complications if you become infected with the virus.

"The CDC continues to update their recommendations for how to reduce your risk of contracting the virus. We will continue to update safety information in light of COVID-19 on this website.

"Each camper will be required to sign a covenant related to COVID-19; when a vaccine is developed we will ask every camper to be vaccinated prior to attending camp unless you have a pre-existing medical condition that prevents you from doing so. We will not turn anyone away from participating in a camp program if they have not been vaccinated."

COTA to Begin Charging Fares on Jan.11

COTA will begin charging fares on <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 11</u> for fixed-route vehicles and COTA//Plus and <u>Monday</u>, <u>February 1</u> for Mainstream and Mainstream On-Demand

According to the company, operates on a fare-based system for its long-term financial sustainability. COTA temporarily suspended transit fares in March because fareboxes are located in the front of all its vehicles. At that time COTA required rear-door boarding of all vehicles to allow time for state-of-the art sanitization practices and implementation of protective measures like facial coverings and increased air circulation to be implemented. Beginning January 11, customers will board at the front entrance and exit at the rear.

"Masks are required for all operators and customers. All COTA vehicles are equipped with strong ventilation systems, to keep air constantly circulating every minute. COTA has implemented daily sanitization procedures that exceed industry standards. COTA uses virus-killing disinfectants and all surfaces of all transit vehicles are coated with Aegis Microbe Shield, which is an antimicrobial solution used in the hospital and food industries. These solutions are applied through spraying, fogging and intensely cleaning every surface. Meanwhile, additional vehicles are being added to improve social distancing on high ridership lines since capacity is reduced to 20 persons on all fixed route transit vehicles."

Customers can now purchase new passes and replace expired passes at the Customer Experience Center at 33 N. High St. in downtown Columbus or at more than 30 grocery store retail locations.
