Redeemer Holds Virtual Annual Meeting

Redeemer held its first ever virtual annual meeting Sunday, January 17 when 59 members participated in the two-hour event via Zoom. (Forty-one members constituted a quorum.) This was in keeping with the church's COVID-19 policy of refraining from in-person events until it is safer.

Incoming President Julie Johnson recognized the work of outgoing council members: Jon Disbro (Outreach), Chad Eberle (secretary), Ruth Murray (Stewardship), Wendy Stoica (Education) and Margie Frazier (president); and outgoing Special Funds Team member Bruce Collins. She also praised the efforts of outgoing Treasurer Larry Trover and Financial Secretary Brad Phillips for their many years of service to the congregation.

She explained that as a result of their retirements, the church is moving to having the Donald Wells CPA firm handle its financial affairs – a transition that is still underway. **Dave Engel** suggested there be an audit of the current books prior to the transfer which Julie said would be referred to council/executive committee.

The 2021-22 slate of officers was elected by acclamation and immediately sworn in. They include the following:

- Vice President (and president-elect) Wendy Stoica
- Secretary Margie Farnham
- Finance Officer **Margie Frazier** (elected to the final year of a two-year term)
- Education Krista Skipper
- Outreach Sue Watson
- Stewardship Laura Warren
- Special Funds Team Terry Warren.

With their new appointment, **Emlyn Ott** and **Marques Highland** join **Margie Farnham** and **Krista Skipper** as members of the Mutual Ministry Team. In addition, the following delegates to the virtual Southern Ohio Synod Assembly on <u>Friday and Saturday, June 4-5</u> were approved: **Julie Johnson** and alternate **Wendy Stoica** and **Brad Phillips** and alternate **Terry Warren.**

Upon recommendation of the Special Funds Team, **Dave Engel**, chair, the following distribution of the interest from the Mission Endowment Fund (estimated to be about \$5,000) was approved: 40 percent to the MidOhio Food Cooperative/Lutheran Social Services Food Pantry; and 15 percent each to the following: LOMO/Lutheran Memorial Camp, First English Sanctuary program; Bishop Griffin Resource Center at Christ the King Catholic Church, and for the families at Berwick Alternative School who were assisted at Christmas.

Julie Johnson, who thanked the congregation for their faithful support in 2020, spent some time taking the congregation through the proposed budget for 2021 prior to its acceptance. Among the items she highlighted were the following:

- Redeemer is in the process of changing banks from PNC to Chase.
- **Margie Frazier** said the church is in the process of seeking to have its PPP \$26,800 loan converted to a grant so it would not need to be repaid.
- The church ended the year with \$90,500 net income. Some of this can be attributed to the congregation's being out of the building; for example, the church saved approximately \$30,000 on utilities. Some of these funds will be applied to a new \$20,000 depreciation

line in the budget to begin to save up for a major building project of replacing the furnaces in the Fellowship Hall in the future. Other of these funds will go to renovating the two main first floor restrooms. Neither is ADA compliant and there have been suggestions of installing either a family or gender neutral restroom. In addition, some of these funds will be used to catch up on Redeemer's benevolence payments which fell behind in 2020.

- Suzuki continues to pay a reduced rent even though they are not in the building.

COVID-19 Information from Columbus Public Health

COVID-19 Vaccines

Beginning <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 19</u> and depending on vaccine supply, <u>Gov. Mike DeWine</u> will open up COVID-19 vaccination to those in Phase 1B which includes those 80 years of age and older. Vaccines will be administered by physicians, local health departments, hospitals, federally qualified health centers, in-home health service providers and some retail pharmacies.

Vaccinations for Ohioans 75 years of age and older begin Monday, January 25 with vaccinations available to those 65 years of age and older as well as school personnel, the following week.

The week of January 25 will also include vaccinations for Ohioans with severe congenital, developmental, or early onset medical disorders.

Under Phase 1A. vaccinations have been given to health care workers, EMS responders, and staff and residents at long-term care facilities.

Columbus, Franklin County Stay at Home Advisory Remains in Effect

The Columbus Public Health and Franklin County Public Health Stay at Home Advisory remains in effect until <u>Saturday</u>, <u>January 23</u>. Residents are advised to stay at home to the greatest extent possible, and to only leave home to go to work or school or for essential needs such as medical care, groceries, medicine and food pick up. While case numbers remain high, the curfew and stay at home advisory are working with cases trending down over the last three weeks. The advisory continues what we are doing to maintain this downward trend while we work to get our community vaccinated and protected.

COVID-19 testing by appointment is offered at the Ohio Expo Center & State Fair Celeste Center in partnership with the hospital systems. To make an appointment, call 614-645-1519. Testing is also available throughout the community. To find a testing site go to: www.columbus.gov/coronavirus.

Lutheran Outdoor Ministries of Ohio (LOMO) announced that registration for 2021 sponsored retreats and summer camp programs will open on <u>Saturday, January 23</u>. The complete schedule can be found online at https://www.lomocamps.org/calendar. The first of the retreats is the Family Spring Retreat at Lutheran Memorial Camp (LMC) on April 23-24. That is followed by Servant Weekends at Camp Luther and LMC in May.

Summer camp programs are scheduled to begin the week of June 13.

LOMO writes, "We have put many safety protocols in place to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19; these procedures are based on the CDC's Field Guide for camps. But, even with safety procedures, we cannot guarantee that COVID-19 will not be spread at camp. While we want everyone to experience the joy and blessings of camp participation we understand that you might choose not to attend camp if you are at high risk for complications if you become infected with the virus.

"The CDC continues to update their recommendations for how to reduce your risk of contracting the virus. We will continue to update safety information in light of COVID-19 on this website.

"Each camper will be required to sign a covenant related to COVID-19; when a vaccine is developed we will ask every camper to be vaccinated prior to attending camp unless you have a pre-existing medical condition that prevents you from doing so. We will not turn anyone away from participating in a camp program if they have not been vaccinated."
