Everyone's talking unity. It's true we as a country have broken into armed camps that look at each other with deep hostility, even seeming to question whether we come from the same planet or are part of the same species. One wonders if we care enough about each other to be willing to do the hard work of discovering what common hope we might have for this moment in history.

We can talk about the need to come together. We can speak of our sadness that no one seems to have come up with any good ideas about how to bridge the ever-widening chasm that separates our various camps. Two weeks ago I talked about the "Braver Angels" groups that are beginning to form in Columbus to create ways for people in opposing camps to listen and talk to each other. At least one couple in Redeemer participated in one of these sessions this weekend. They said it was a beautifully run event. I look forward to hearing more about how the time offered a different story than we've been living for so long.

For me, songs often paint a picture of a better story. I find myself singing songs and the words start to work on softening my heart and steeling my spirit and challenging my hands and feet to do something. Last spring I discovered a song called "See the Love" by The Brilliance. I don't think a week has gone by since then that I haven't played it again. It is the best Gospel I know for these times. I encourage you to listen to it online. I hope it gives you a picture of what might be possible. And the courage to try to make the spirit of the song real. Imagine looking at people in whose face I don't know how to see God ... and singing, "I wanna see the love all around you!" That could change this world.

Information on Getting COVID Vaccine

Nurse and Redeemer member **Michelle Skoog** provides the following information about how to get the COVID-19 vaccination: "In case you or a loved one are in need of a COVID vaccine, and meet age requirements, there are several options available. Currently, Ohio is vaccinating Group 1B. This is for people aged 65 and up, beginning with 80+. This week, the week of January 25, Ohio is vaccinating age 75 and older. Several places are providing the vaccine (although supply is limited), including some store pharmacies such as Kroger, Giant Eagle and Walmart. Primary care providers, associated with a major hospital system, may also have some availability for their patients who meet age requirements. "Another easy option is your local health department. For Franklin County residents, currently 75 or older, vaccination appointments are being scheduled for this Monday and Tuesday. You can register online for an appointment at http://bit.ly/vax2normal or by calling the appointment hotline at 614-525-5225. Vaccinations are done at the Franklin County Board of Elections on Morse Road. You choose an appointment time when you register. Franklin County's registration typically opens for the next age group Thursdays at 1 p.m. of the week prior to that age group's assigned week.

"If you are a Columbus or Worthington resident, age 75 or older, vaccination appointments may also be made through the Columbus Health Department. They are available online for this week at: https://redcap.columbus.gov/surveys/?s=8C9FTR78EN or by calling Columbus Public Health at 614-645-1519 to schedule an appointment time. Vaccinations are drive-through at the fairgrounds. The time that Columbus Public Health has opened up appointment slots have varied the past two weeks. One week it was Friday of the week prior and the next week it was Saturday. Best advice: start checking online the Thursday before your age range and keep checking!

"In case registration is listed as closed at either public health website (as it is as of January 24 at Columbus Public Health for ages 75 and up), registration often will reopen throughout the week once more vaccine supply becomes available. Keep checking back!

Souper Bowl Takes on New Format in COVID Times

Grape jelly: 15-17 oz. in plastic bottles.

Black beans: 15.5 oz. Diced tomatoes: 15.5 oz. Mandarin oranges: 11 oz. Tuna *in water*: 5 oz.

Soups: Tomato, chicken noodle or vegetable.

If you would prefer to bring food items to the church, **Kathy Mimlitch** is willing to deliver them – or she would pick them up from homes.

COVID-19 Information from Columbus Public Health

COVID-19 Vaccines

Beginning Monday, January 25 and depending on vaccine supply, Gov. Mike DeWine will open up COVID-19 vaccination to those in Phase 1B which includes those 75 years of age and older. Vaccines will be administered by physicians, local health departments, hospitals, federally qualified health centers, in-home health service providers and some retail pharmacies. Vaccinations will be available to those 65 years of age and older as well as school personnel, the following week.

The week of January 25 will also include vaccinations for Ohioans with severe congenital, developmental, or early onset medical disorders. See article on p. 2 about how to schedule an appointment.

Under Phase 1A. vaccinations have been given to health care workers, EMS responders, and staff and residents at long-term care facilities.

Columbus, Franklin County Stay at Home Advisory Remains in Effect

The Columbus Public Health and Franklin County Public Health Stay at Home Advisory remains in effect until <u>Saturday</u>, <u>January 30</u>. Residents are advised to stay at home to the greatest extent possible, and to only leave home to go to work or school or for essential needs such as medical care, groceries, medicine and food pick up. While case numbers remain high, the curfew and stay at home advisory are working with cases trending down over the last three weeks. The advisory continues what we are doing to maintain this downward trend while we work to get our community vaccinated and protected.

COVID-19 Testing

COVID-19 testing by appointment is offered at the Ohio Expo Center & State Fair Celeste Center in partnership with the hospital systems. To make an appointment, call 614-645-1519. Testing is also available throughout the community. To find a testing site go to: www.columbus.gov/coronavirus.

Help Prevent COVID-19!

Please do your part to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

- Only go out for essential activities.
- Celebrate holidays only with people in your own household.
- Always wear a face covering.
- Practice social distancing by staying six feet apart from others.
- Wash your hands often and use hand sanitizer.
- Stay home if you are sick and avoid contact with people in your household.
- Avoid gatherings with people outside of your household and large groups.

Registration for 2021 LOMO Camp Programs Now Open

Lutheran Outdoor Ministries of Ohio (LOMO) announced that registration for 2021 sponsored retreats and summer camp programs opened on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>January 23</u>. The complete schedule can be found online at https://www.lomocamps.org/calendar. The first of the retreats is the Family Spring Retreat at Lutheran Memorial Camp (LMC) on April 23-24. That is followed by Servant Weekends at Camp Luther and LMC in May.

Summer camp programs are scheduled to begin the week of June 13.

LOMO writes, "We have put many safety protocols in place to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19; these procedures are based on the CDC's Field Guide for camps. But, even with safety procedures, we cannot guarantee that COVID-19 will not be spread at camp. While we want everyone to experience the joy and blessings of camp participation we understand that you might choose not to attend camp if you are at high risk for complications if you become infected with the virus.

"The CDC continues to update their recommendations for how to reduce your risk of contracting the virus. We will continue to update safety information in light of COVID-19 on this website.

"Each camper will be required to sign a covenant related to COVID-19; when a vaccine is developed we will ask every camper to be vaccinated prior to attending camp unless you have a pre-existing medical condition that prevents you from doing so. We will not turn anyone away from participating in a camp program if they have not been vaccinated."
