

In Preparation for Worship

- Within the sanctuary please remember that some people use this time of silence to prepare for worship.
- Whenever the cross is carried in procession through the congregation, we turn to face the cross to signify our way of life as followers of Jesus.



Lift up your hearts.


And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.

Generous God whose story and song are now and always the hope of the world: We praise you for the stories of creation and incarnation redemption and resolution – the unending words of love. We rejoice in your song of yearning and calling waiting and welcoming gathering and cherishing – the eternal music of hope. And we join our voices now in that great song of love and adoration that creation sings back to you.



We remember on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given to thanks to you, he broke it and gave it to his friends and said — "Take, eat: This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me."

And so, as we do in this place what Christ did in an upstairs room, send your Holy Spirit on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine, that the story of hope – of death and rising of new life, and the fruit of your beloved community – may continue on in us and through us.
