Redeemer Artisans through the Years

Thanks to **Karen Collins** for updating this overview of those Redeemer members through the years who have shared their talents with the congregation.

Over the decades, Redeemer Congregation has been blessed with many members who were and are talented artisans. Their contributions have enhanced our worship and enable us to enjoy unique and one-of-a-kind designs in our sanctuary.

1957

In the congregation's earliest days, the artisans were woodworkers, **Neil Bruce** and **Ted Cook**, both charter members. Ted was on the first church council as a trustee and Neil was the first deacon of the congregation. Ted constructed a sign, placed on our newly-purchased cow pasture, announcing the future site of a new Lutheran mission. Ted also constructed a portable altar and lectern to use for services held at Berwick Elementary School.

1958

For Redeemer's first building, Neil and Ted designed and built an altar, baptismal font, pulpit and lectern, as well as kneeling rails for the chancel with holders for wine glasses.

<u>1976</u>

Neil used the original brass altar cross to make a processional cross. He delighted in the story that the brass bar in the middle of the processional cross was a crash bar from a door in the no-longer existing Eastern Theatre on E. Main St.

1979

Neil built a wooden holder for the Paschal candle.

2002

The newly-remodeled sanctuary was dedicated in February 2002. It features the work of several talented Redeemer members: **Bob Battiste** was not only a talented musician and choir director, but he was also a builder and finish-carpenter. Bob designed and made the altar table, the ambo (reading desk and pulpit) and the baptismal font that are used today. He also did all the finish carpentry in the sanctuary, including the steps. **Tamara Wawrosch** made two large ceramic bowls for use in the new baptismal font. **Michelle Clemence** designed and made all of the paraments for use on the altar and many processional banners as well as several large hangings for festival seasons.

<u>2005</u>

Three stained glass windows, installed in the chancel and both transepts, were designed by **Michelle Clemence.** They represent the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

<u>2015-2021</u>

Nelson Meyer designed and made a new processional cross as well as the cross mounted on the wall in the Narthex. Nelson also designed and made the wooden

This month, to supplement the giveaway, contributions of paper goods, such as paper towels, toilet tissue, baby wipes, etc. are being requested. (Please bag toilet paper in twos.) "The giveaway guests appreciate these extra items so much, and we are grateful for the generosity of this congregation! And as always, we are indebted to our volunteers who make the whole process look seamlessly easy."

Those considering volunteering for the August 19 event can just call the church office! The event is drive-thru and safety protocols (gloves, masks, physical distancing) will remain in place. The core team usually arrives at 1 p.m. to set up. The food, which arrives by 2 p.m., will be sorted into appropriate family size quantities. There are a number of different volunteer roles including traffic control, check-in, food sorting and bagging, food picking from each station, etc. The giveaway then runs from 3 to 6 p.m. Volunteers of all ages are welcome.

Looking Ahead to Fall

A couple things about scheduling the rest of the summer and fall.

Redeemer's attendance for in-person worship leads the Worship Team and council to decide **to stay with one 10 a.m. worship service through December.** "All of us felt strongly that we enjoy the vibrant feel of more people in worship. And we know any visitors will sense that we are a more vital, healthy congregation when they see more people in a service. We'll look at in-person attendance numbers later in the fall and see what they indicate."

Also: Redeemer's traditional five-evening **Vacation Bible School**. Because younger kids can't be vaccinated, and the church is not yet ready to open Fellowship Hall to groups, it was decided this summer to offer a full-on **KidFest out on the lawn on <u>Sunday, August 29</u> from 2-4 p.m. Please invite younger folks you know to come.** (See separate story, this issue.)

The Education Team is also responding to feedback from parents and so are planning for **one Sunday School gathering each month for children and youth** that will engage them in a wide variety of ways and not ask for weekly commitments from adults who are still feeling stretched in so many ways.

According to **Pastor Dave**, "We continue to need to be nimble, creative, and willing to do things in ways we haven't imagined before. As the people are about to leave their long exile in Babylon, God proclaims, 'I'm doing a new thing! Don't you see?' We ask you to try on the new things we are offering this fall, as we seek to be the most faithful body of Christ we can be."

Good Neighbors Picnic Coming Sept. 25 to Wolf Park

The Good Neighbors Picnic will be held this year on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>September 25</u> at Wolfe Park on the east side of Columbus. Redeemer members and friends are invited to begin donating new or gently used blankets and cold weather clothing and accessories to help provide for our homeless brothers and sisters in the Columbus area.

This all-day event was started in 1999 by Redeemer member **William McCully** along with a few volunteers as part of the National Make a Difference Day. On the day of the Good Neighbors Picnic, volunteers work to provide a day of celebration including food, music, games, books, family photos, crafts, and shopping at a Free Store for blankets and winter clothing. In 2019, close to a thousand guests, men, women, and children of all ages from local shelters, were transported to the park for this day of celebration and fun.

Redeemer, along with other faith organizations, community leaders, local businesses and organizations will work to gather in items for those who are homeless or in shelters.

Donations may be placed in the bin located in the Narthex. Cash donations or gift cards are welcome and may be dropped off at the church office.

Dementia/Alzheimer's Caregiver Support Group in Berwick

Every second Tuesday of each month a Dementia/Alzheimer's caregiver support group meets in Berwick at Redeemer Lutheran Church from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. Meetings are open to all caregivers who wish to attend. Most participants come from the immediate communities. There is no charge to attend.

Within meetings, individuals share caregiver concerns and challenges; group participants provide each other caring support, ideas for self-care, and everyday problem solving and care tips for the person affected by dementia.

The caregiver group is an outreach of the Central Ohio Alzheimer's Association. At the meetings information is shared about the association's services and those provided by other community agencies
