## A Chance to Talk about Justice Issues You Care About

Redeemer is filled with people who care about what's going on in the worlds outside of our immediate lives. We often wish there were ways we could do something tangible to bring healing, understanding, and justice to Columbus and Franklin County.

Over the next several weeks, you have a chance to gather in a small group to talk about a justice issue you care about – something that keeps you up at night, something you wish you could change in some way. And this might be the first step to having that issue become a priority that the BREAD organization votes to pursue in the coming year.

Redeemer recently joined over 40 area Christian and Jewish faith communities to become a member congregation in BREAD – Building Responsibility, Equality, And Dignity. BREAD builds the power that a large number of committed, engaged people uniquely have to bring their concerns before policymakers. Members of BREAD do research to find policies that have proven effective, present those to policymakers, and ask these policymakers to make a public promise to make these policies real.

For example, BREAD was one of the leading voices calling on Mayor Andrew Ginther to look for a new police chief. BREAD knew real reform meant looking for a new chief from outside the ranks of the Columbus Division of Police. That effort brought us Chief Elaine Bryant. Knowing there are thousands of people who are part of BREAD congregations gives us tremendous power.

The first step in introducing people to BREAD and learning about the issues that people in BREAD congregations care about is what's called a house meeting. Small groups from the congregation gather to talk about what justice issues they care deeply about, and what makes this issue so important to them. The house meeting facilitators will take these issues to a BREAD meeting next month where all the issues that were voiced around the county will be gathered.

At the end of the house meeting, you'll also be invited to see if you might like to stay connected with BREAD during this next year. There's no expectation those who come to a house meeting will get more involved. We want to give you that chance, though. For those of you who might be curious, we'll let you know what's possible for you to do to put your passion into action.

### RLC's Current Worship Protocol: *Love Your Neighbor*

- \* We strongly encourage all people to wear masks in worship and in other larger group settings.
- \* Both sides of the sanctuary are set up for social distancing.
- \* Those who wish may stand during the opening and closing hymns and the reading of the Gospel.
- \* During the passing of the peace, we suggest you wave or place your palms together under your chin in the "namaste" posture as a way to share the peace in a distanced way.
- \* Individual communion elements are available to pick up inside the Sanctuary door.
- \* If you wish to use one of the first-floor bathrooms, please follow instructions in the bathroom about disinfecting it after your use. Only one person at a time in the restrooms.

### Don Luck to Discuss Jesus and the Trinity

**Don Luck**, professor emeritus of systematic theology at Trinity Lutheran Seminary is in the midst of presenting a four-part exploration of the person and significance of **Jesus** that reflects contemporary biblical and theological scholarship and that reaches beyond popular assumptions by many both within and outside the Christian community. The Adult Education sessions run from 11:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. following the Sunday worship service in Room 2 and on Zoom. Here are the themes he will be addressing over the next two weeks:

**September 26: Re-introducing Jesus and the Trinity.** Because Jesus and God are firmly linked, Christian language about God gets complicated. The result sounds like an exotic – if not irrational – mathematical formula to be taken “on faith.” Dr. Luck will explore the meaning of God’s “tri-unity.”

**October 3: Re-introducing Jesus and Non-Christians.** Numbers of informed voices in the Christian community are challenging St. Cyprian’s assertion that “No one can have God as Father without having the Church as Mother.” Find out why and how.

### **An Update from Jill Disbro**

Daughter of the congregation, **Jill Disbro**, who has been on internship from seminary over the past year, shared the following update:

“Greetings, Redeemer! As you know, this past year I was on internship at Our Redeemer Church in Garden Grove, CA. It has been a wonderful year, even during COVID. Being in Southern California we were able to meet outside for worship during most of the pandemic and eventually in our sanctuary as well. I got a lot of great practice preaching and leading worship, leading Bible Study, and working with our Grief Support Group. I also got to work with a nearby Spanish-speaking congregation, where I preached several times in Spanish and worked with children and youth in the community. I learned a lot this past year and have really enjoyed getting to grow in the pastor role.

“I completed my internship last week and wanted to share a little bit of news about what is next for me. I just started working as the new director of admission at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (the seminary I attended in Berkeley, CA)! In this position I am responsible for recruiting prospective students, walking with them as they discern, hosting discernment weekends and visit events here at the seminary, and much more. It’s a called position and the previous director of admission was ordained into this role as a specialized ministry call. My hope is to pursue that path as well, although it is not a guarantee that this alternative path will be approved by the conference of bishops for ordination. Either way, though, I’m really excited for this opportunity to serve the seminary and contribute to the way the seminary is training leaders for the future of the church. Just in my first few days, I’ve really been able to feel like I’m in the right place at this time in my ministry journey.

“Thanks to all of you for your continued support and prayers. Redeemer has been such an important partner for me in this path, and I’m grateful for all the ways the church and individuals have supported and encouraged me financially, emotionally, and spiritually. Many blessings on the coming months as we all continue to adjust to ever-changing COVID realities. You are all in my heart and prayers.”

### Lutheran Disaster Response Assists Following Hurricane Ida

The headlines are filled with the devastation from Hurricane Ida, which made landfall near New Orleans on Sunday, August 29 – exactly 16 years after Hurricane Katrina. As a strong Category 4 storm, Hurricane Ida's 150 mph winds, torrential rain and strong storm surge caused widespread flooding and wind damage in Southeastern Louisiana and coastal Mississippi. Homes were flooded and debris has clogged the roads. Strong winds knocked out power lines and electrical substations, leaving more than 1 million people without power, including the entirety of New Orleans. In some areas, electricity is not expected to be restored for weeks.

While Ida weakened into a tropical storm as it moved inland it also caused devastating heavy flooding in the Northeast.

The impact of Ida is yet to be fully assessed, but with a hurricane of this scale, rebuilding will be costly and take years. With extensive experience in accompanying communities throughout the relief and long-term recovery phases, Lutheran Disaster Response is working with local ELCA synods and Lutheran social service organizations to coordinate a response to Hurricane Ida. Immediate needs will include food, basic necessities and temporary housing. Long after the headlines change, Lutheran Disaster Response will continue to accompany communities on the journey of rebuilding their homes and lives.

## The Community Beyond

### ODI Warns Ohioans about Medicare Scams

**Department of Insurance (ODI) Director Judith L. French** urges Ohioans on Medicare to guard against scams seeking their personal information when selecting 2022 coverage during the **Friday, October 15** to **Tuesday, December 7** open enrollment period.

"Fraud is rampant this time of year. Scammers know people are overwhelmed evaluating the different Medicare plans," French said. "I encourage Ohioans to learn how to best protect themselves and become more familiar with Medicare. As a consumer protection agency, we're closely monitoring the marketplace with our partners to protect Ohioans."

Ohioans should be on alert for fake Medicare communications seeking personal information or money in exchange for any of the following: to help with enrollment, to schedule health services, to sign up for a Part D prescription drug plan or Medicare health plan coverage, and to provide a new Medicare card.

#### How to protect yourself:

- Never give personal information, including Medicare, Social Security, bank account, and credit card numbers, to anyone who contacts you unsolicited by telephone, email, text, or in person, such as door-to-door sales.
- Medicare will never call you to sell anything, visit your home, or enroll you over the phone unless you called first.
- Medicare or Medicare health plans will only call and request personal information if you're a plan member or you called and left a message.
- Only give certain personal information to your doctors, insurance companies acting on your behalf, or trusted people in the community officially working with Medicare such as the department's Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program (OSHIIP).

#### Report fraud and predatory sales practices:

- OSHIIP partners with Ohio's Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) to detect and report wrongdoing. The SMP provides education and response to reported Medicare fraud, waste, and abuse. Contact SMP at 800-488-6070.
- If you feel an insurance agent is using high-pressure, fraudulent, or dishonest sales practices, contact the department's Fraud and Enforcement Division at 800-686-1527 or the SMP.

Every second Thursday of each month a Dementia/Alzheimer's caregiver support group meets in-person at Redeemer Lutheran Church from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. Meetings are open to all caregivers who wish to attend. Most participants come from the immediate communities. There is no charge to attend.

Within meetings, individuals share caregiver concerns and challenges; group participants provide each other caring support, ideas for self-care, and everyday problem solving and care tips for the person affected by dementia.

The caregiver group is an outreach of the Central Ohio Alzheimer's Association. At the meetings information is shared about the association's services and those provided by other community agencies

Also, every third Thursday of each month, a virtual Dementia/Alzheimer's Caregiver Support Group meets via Zoom, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. If you wish to attend, please register through the Alzheimer's Association Helpline, 800-272-3900. After registration, you will receive the Zoom link for the online meeting. (Do not try to register on the national website which is experiencing problems.)
