

On Redeemer's Becoming Involved in BREAD

Every summer, Redeemer has a book study. In July of 2019, the book was *So You Want to Talk About Race* by by **Ijeoma Oluo**. Normally, the book study meets weekly in July and then it is finished. But the 2019 book study took hold and nobody wanted to stop meeting. The group continued to meet, approximately monthly, to learn about various topics related to race. They read more books; they had speakers; they watched movies; and they had discussions. In addition to learning about the issues, they researched various groups that are working on solutions. One of those groups was the BREAD Organization.

BREAD's mission, per its website, is to build the power of people of faith to solve community problems. In meetings with thousands of community residents, the organization presses targeted decision makers to implement solutions to those problems. Every year, the organization:

- Conducts a listening and voting process to choose one new community problem that is added to the organization's list of issues
- Trains dozens of leaders to research that problem and identify proven solutions
- Identifies solutions and the research committee identifies the appropriate decision maker in the community with the authority to implement that solution
- Brings out thousands of people from BREAD congregations to the annual Nehemiah Action Meeting to press those decision makers for specific commitments
- Follows up, throughout the year, with those officials to ensure that the solutions are implemented

On April 14, 2021, Redeemer's Anti-Racism Group voted to recommend to council that Redeemer join BREAD because it is an established organization with a proven history of getting results. BREAD would give Redeemer a chance to truly make a difference and allow various entry points for members. Those entry points include reading the *Reflections* articles and BREAD bulletin board, attending meetings at Redeemer, attending citywide BREAD meetings, joining the BREAD Organization as a Justice Ministry Network Member, joining the research groups ... the opportunities are limitless. One Redeemer attendee commented that they have been so frustrated by feeling powerless especially after **George Floyd's** murder and they are overjoyed to finally be doing something constructive.

On April 20, 2021, Redeemer's Church Council followed the recommendation of the Anti-Racism Group and joined BREAD. On June 28, Redeemer was welcomed into BREAD membership. Redeemer has now entered into BREAD's yearly cycle. BREAD is currently in the listening phase where individual faith communities hold "house meetings" to listen to what people are concerned about. Redeemer jumped right in, holding five "house meetings." People were great! They attended and spoke freely about what is on their minds. They passionately voiced concerns about education, access to food and housing, neighborhood safety, rising utility bills, policing, climate change and other issues.

RLC's Current Worship Protocol: Love Your Neighbor

- * Masks are required in worship and in other larger group settings.
- * Both sides of the sanctuary are set up for social distancing.
- * Those who wish may stand during the opening and closing hymns and the reading of the Gospel.

- 1 box or bag of stuffing mix
- 1 turkey gravy packet

Special Funds Team Information

The following information is provided to the Redeemer Lutheran Church (RLC) congregation by the Special Funds Team (SFT) as recommended in the SFT Charter.

Memorial and Special Gifts Fund Information

The Memorial and Special Gifts Fund receives gifts given to RLC in memory or in honor of an individual/group and these gifts other than usual contributions are considered "Special" by the Congregation Council. The fund may accept two kinds of gifts:

Unrestricted gifts - not restricted as to use by the donor.

Restricted gifts - restricted to use by the donor.

Memorial Gifts Distribution Procedure:

The SFT shall announce to the congregation (at least annually) the purpose and availability of unrestricted gift monies in the fund, soliciting suggestions for its use. The SFT shall recommend to the Congregation Council any distribution of the Memorial Gifts funds.

Special Gifts: Mary Kohler Ministry Fund Distribution Procedure:

Applications for educational purposes and for new and existing RLC neighborhood ministries receive priority.

The SFT shall announce to the congregation (at least annually) the purpose and availability of the monies in the fund and solicit suggestions for use. The SFT may recommend a distribution of funds to the Congregation Council. The funds are distributed at the direction of the Congregation Council.

A quick note about jargon. Redeemer benefits from BREAD's being established and extremely organized. Naturally they come with a new vocabulary that is unfamiliar at the moment. A couple of examples:

BREAD – Building Responsibility Equality and Dignity -- name of the organization.

- **House meetings** Listening sessions that happen in homes, coffee shops, churches, synagogues and on Zoom when people share what their greatest struggles are.
- **Team Members** People who lead their faith community in their BREAD efforts are called Team Members.

Justice Ministry Network Members (JMNM) - People who commit to engage with a handful of asks:

- 1. Bring at least three people to the big Nehemiah Action in May 2022
- 2. Attend three other citywide assemblies
 - a. Annual Assembly on Monday, November 15, 2021
 - b. Rally in April 2022
 - c. Celebration in June 2022
- 3. Consider investing \$200 or more

What's next? Redeemer is just starting out. The main thing is that the BREAD group wants to keep the lines of communication open between BREAD and Redeemer. They will let you know when there are events going on and progress being made. The opportunity is always available to get more involved. The BREAD group is always available to talk if you want to learn more.

The next officially sanctioned BREAD event is the Annual Assembly on <u>Monday, November 15</u>. This meeting is to hear about the results from the Listening Process and to join with hundreds of others to commit to follow up on those conversations with the Issue Work. You could consider coming to that. You can just keep reading *Reflections* articles about BREAD and checking the bulletin board and see where it goes.

This is how we have begun, but it is just the beginning of a hopeful long and fruitful partnership!

We had 162 families -- that's 38 more than the next highest number this summer! There were 61 new families! We served a total of 567 people, 174 of whom were children and 125 were seniors.
