Grace Missions Haiti

As new members at Redeemer, we were surprised when **Pastor Dave** invited us to propose a mission project for the 2022 Special Funds allocation. We submitted a project close to our hearts that was accepted, and here is its story: **Grace Missions Haiti** of Port-au-Prince, with 25 years of service supported by U.S.-based Lutheran and other Christian congregations. In 1994 a Haitian named **Marie Majors** was attending Bible College in Florida and working for a wealthy elderly couple as live-in caregiver. They both died without children and left the entire estate (*including the Jaguar!*) to Marie. Marie was shocked, prayed about it, and felt called by Jesus to sell it all, and build a school for homeless children back in Haiti. So began "Marie's House of Grace," a school for girls who were orphaned or whose often-single moms were living (and often working and/or begging) "on the streets" and couldn't take care of them.

Karen Rider learned about the mission from members in two of our previous ELCA congregations (Lexington KY and Indianapolis IN), which led her to make the first of her four trips to Haiti in 2009. Marie's girls captured her heart. Karen gladly volunteered to be a founding board member of a new 501(c)(3) U.S. nonprofit called "Grace Missions Haiti" that formed to support the work. Karen was the first board secretary, newsletter editor, and photographer. Over half the new board members today are U.S. residents of Haitian descent, and over half the support comes from U.S. Lutherans. (Go to www.gracemissionsinc.org for more information.)

The terrible 2010 earthquake in Haiti brought down Marie's original school, dorm, and chapel, along with many other buildings in Port-au-Prince, but thankfully with no loss of life among the girls or staff. Based on a funding appeal, the board was able to purchase a large home on an acre of land in 2014 and named it "Chez Moi" (French for "My Home"). It currently houses 30 girls of all ages, plus playground and gardens. It's accredited by Haiti's Institute for Social Welfare and is staffed with a social worker, a nurse, and house parents. The girls attend the new Christian school nearby and are active in the local church. Their birth parents (if they have parents living) are always free to visit and are included in the girls' activities.

A second outreach adopted by the board is the College Scholarship Fund, to educate young Haitians to serve their neighbors in our hemisphere's poorest economy. We currently have two young men who've just finished medical degrees in Haiti, now doing residency at University of Kentucky Hospital in Lexington before returning home to Port-au-Prince. One of them is an ophthalmologist; the other will be the first heart surgeon in Haiti, <u>ever</u>.... We also have two young women now in nursing training, both of whom grew up as residents at Chez Moi.

Karen is now retired from the board after two terms, but we continue as strong supporters of Grace Missions. *Thank you* to all of you at Redeemer for your partnership with us and other U.S. Christians in this mission to bless young Haitians with hope, energy, and a vision to lead their country out of poverty and despair.

Kristi Hildebrand writes, "We asked BREAD Network Members to answer a handful of questions. We will share the answers in Reflections during 2022." This month, the focus is on **Carol Heacock.**

Justice issues that keep you up: "People who are not 'seen' are the ones who keep me awake. This can be the Native American tribes who have been forgotten, the homeless that we walk by or hand them a quick dollar and go on with our lives, or the student who has no one to support them or encourage them and are so easily labeled as 'troublemakers.'"

Why you joined the justice ministry/BREAD as a network member: "In the past, Bernice Stewart and I worked together on BREAD and I loved being a part of this diverse group of people coming together for a common cause. I also was so excited when the organization developed concrete solutions and identified people and strategies that could work towards solving the problem and therefore, supporting those who didn't have a voice or a means."

Favorite type of bread: "It's just impossible for me to name just one. I have favorites depending on if it's with soup, I go with crusty sourdough, rye or grainy whole wheat, those are my favorites with sandwiches, just to name a couple."

Justice prayer for 2022: "That we, as a country, as a community, as individuals might SEE our neighbor. Maybe that neighbor is someone down the street that we've never taken the time to chat with, maybe it's a person that serves our Starbucks, or folks we pass as we drive to First English to serve dinner. I pray that we take the time to get to know each other's story, grow to respect each other, and lean on each other. I have learned over and over the past few years, our Lord never intended for anyone to walk this journey of life alone."

Message from Bishop Eaton on Ukraine

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9).

"I watch with grave concern as tensions continue between Russia and Ukraine, and I fervently pray that a peaceful resolution to the conflict will be reached. I affirm the statement of the Lutheran World Federation's general secretary, **Rev. Dr. Anne Burghardt**: 'We urge all parties to de-escalate the situation and work for peace and stability. A peaceful solution must be found.'

"Our social statement *For Peace in God's World* offers guidance: 'We of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America share with the Church of Jesus Christ in all times and places the calling to be peacemakers.... [T]he basis of the Church's peace-calling is in God's final peace, the peace of God's eternal reign. That calling is to proclaim the Gospel of God's final peace and to work for earthly peace.'

"Join with me in praying for peace for the people of Ukraine and that the international community will play a constructive role in this regard. We pray also for the Ukrainian diaspora in our context, that they may know God's peace."

Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order four free at-home COVID-19 tests. Orders will usually ship in seven to 12 days.

COVID-19 Drive-Thru Testing Station Opens at OSU - East Hospital

A drive-thru COVID-19 testing station at East Hospital is providing **symptomatic/asymptomatic with exposure testing** for individuals who live in targeted zip codes on the Near Eastside.

The East Hospital location addresses the increased demand for testing and provides convenient access for individuals (community and health care personnel) living in zip codes 43203, 43201, 43205, 43206, 43207, 43211, 43215, 43219, 43222, 43223 and 43224. Appointments are required for all patients (community and health care personnel).

The Community Care Coach staff, along with five National Guardsmen, will support the East Hospital testing station located in the ACC parking area in front of East Hospital. To access the drive-thru station, patients must follow posted signs and enter from the Phale D. Hale St. entrance.

To schedule an appointment use MyChart or call 614-293-4000: Individuals with a MyChart account can schedule a COVID-19 test without the need to contact the COVID-19 Call Team or their own Wexner Medical Center provider.

All available appointments for testing are viewable in MyChart. Individuals without a MyChart account can call the COVID-19 Call Center at 614-293-4000 or contact their primary care physician.

There is no cost for the testing.
