Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

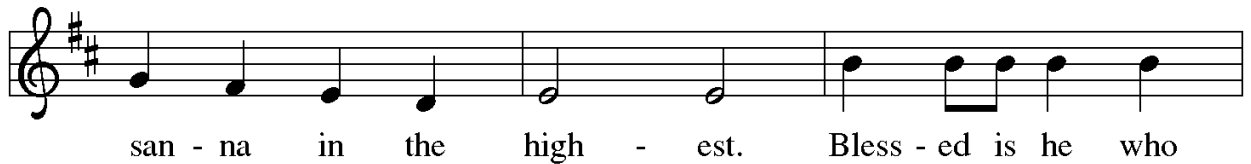
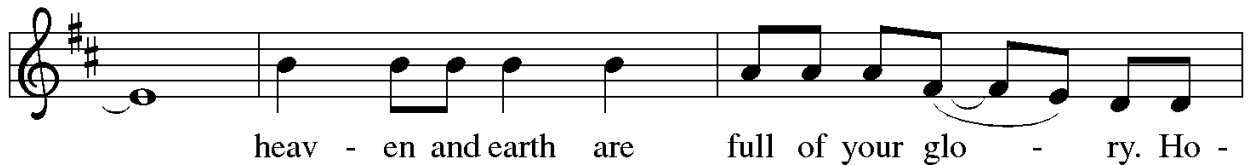
**And also with you.
