

# **Great Thanksgiving**


The Lord be with you. Lift up your hearts. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.

The body of Christ, given for you. (We eat the bread together.) The blood of Christ, shed for you. (We drink the cup together.)










