The Lord says:



So will I bless you as long | as I live and lift up my hands | in your name.


My spirit is content, as with the rich- | est of foods, and my mouth praises you with | joyful lips,

And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


Prayer of Thanksgiving


