In Preparation for Worship

- Within the sanctuary please remember that some people use this time of silence to prepare for worship.
- Whenever the cross is carried in procession through the congregation, we turn to face the cross to signify our way of life as followers of Jesus.
- Large-print bulletins and copies of the worship order are available; ask an usher for assistance.
- Assistive hearing devices are available from the ushers.

Love Your Neighbor

- Masks are required coming into the building and in the Narthex. Folks wishing to continue wearing
 masks for worship are encouraged to sit in the pews on the north side of the Sanctuary; those who wish
 to remove their masks may sit on the south side of the Sanctuary.
- Those who wish may stand during the opening and closing hymns and the reading of the Gospel.
- <u>During the passing of the peace</u>, we suggest you place your palms together under your chin in the "namaste" posture as a way to share the peace in a distanced way.
- Individual communion elements are available to pick up inside the Sanctuary door or folks can now choose to receive communion at the front of the church from masked servers distributing individual cups for the wine/grape juice.
- If you wish to use one of the first-floor bathrooms, please follow instructions in the bathroom about disinfecting it after your use. Only one person at a time in the restrooms.
- Please silence your cell phone.



Great Thanksgiving


The Lord be with you.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.





Before retirement, Al was pastor at Servants of Christ ELCA, Indianapolis; and prior to that served three congregations around Washington DC, and an international congregation in Frankfurt-am-Main, Germany. While in Europe, Al also coordinated US Federal chaplaincy programs for the ELCA and led initiatives in former East Germany and Czechoslovakia. Back in the states, Al then worked as a career-vocational counselor based in Lexington, KY, with secular clients, seminary students/ interns, and church professionals going through life transition.

Karen is a trained geographer who started her career in the US Geological Survey's National Mapping Division, then transitioned to church administrator jobs in Germany, Kentucky and Indiana. In her personal ministry, Karen helped found the Board for a church-related mission supporting young people in Haiti. Between them, they've been active in 30+ countries.

They're now active grandparents to Sophie (6) and Emma (4), and Al does spiritual direction and editing for Sage-ing International, an interfaith global network of "active elders".

They were attracted to Redeemer by the preaching and music, the commitment to justice, mission and care of the earth, the vibrant liturgical art, the Reconciling in Christ affiliation... Everything is a fit. Al will occasionally be "on the road" supply preaching in the future, but we both plan to be deeply involved at RLC.
