If It's Popular Every July, Why Not Monthly?

Soon after I (Dave) began working here at Redeemer five years and a handful of days ago, I was told about your tradition of a summer book group. I learned people gathered every week for a month during the summer to read and discuss a book together. In the summers I've been here, we've discussed *The Cross and the Lynching Tree, So You Want to Talk about Race, Being Mortal*, and *Caste*. COVID took one of our summers ... and so much more! ... from us.

At the end of July, after a marvelously diverse group of readers from four different faith communities finished *Caste* this summer, the two of us (Dave and Sheryl) got to talking. We decided if so many people are interested in discussing a book every July, maybe people might be interested in more regular book discussion opportunities. So we're going to give it a try.

Beginning <u>Wednesday evening</u>, October 19, we're launching a third-Wednesday-of-the-month book discussion group. It's different from the summer book group in several ways. First, we'll discuss the whole book in one session. So they'll be shorter books than our summer ones. Second, we won't just read nonfiction books. We'll do novels, short stories, essays, etc. Third, we aren't going to pick them all! We want your suggestions about books you think the group would enjoy. Fourth, because we're changing the format and reading a wider variety of books, we hope people who aren't non-fiction fans might join us.

The October book has been around for quite a while, and it created quite a stir when it first came out in 2007. *The Shack* was written by Canadian author **William P. Young**, who self-published the book, only for it to become a million-seller; a movie based on the book was made in 2017, and starred Academy-Award winner **Octavia Spencer**. This past weekend, a Redeemer member told Dave they were re-reading *The Shack* and are finding that it speaks powerfully to things going on in their life right now.

So if you'd like to give this new group a try, find a copy of *The Shack* in whatever format you prefer. The July conversations have blessed participants with honesty, openness, stories that changed us. Who knows where these next conversations might take us? RLC's Current Worship Protocol: Love Your Neighbor

- * Masks are required coming into the building and in the Narthex. Folks wishing to continue wearing masks for worship are encouraged to sit in the pews on the north side of the Sanctuary; those who wish to remove their masks may sit on the south side of the Sanctuary.
- * Those who wish may stand during the opening and closing hymns and the reading of the Gospel.
- * During the passing of the peace, we suggest you wave or place your palms together under your chin in the "namaste" posture as a way to share the peace in a distanced way.
- * Individual communion elements are available to pick up inside the Sanctuary door or folks can now choose to receive communion at the front of the church from masked servers distributing individual cups for the wine/grape juice.
- * If you wish to use one of the first-floor bathrooms, please follow instructions in the bathroom about disinfecting it after your use. Only one person at a time in the restrooms.
- * Please silence cellphones.

Personal Products, Volunteers Needed for Thursday's Food Giveaway

Both volunteers and donations of personal products are needed for the next food giveaway which is scheduled for this week on <u>Thursday, September 15</u> on the Redeemer parking. Set up begins about 1 p.m.; the giveaway runs from 3 to 6 p.m.

"Extra" items will be personal products such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, dental floss, body lotion, nail care kits, etc. because these items are not available for those using food stamps. Place items in the appropriate container in the coatroom.

Warren Reports on Stewardship Activities

Laura Warren, Stewardship Team chairperson and council representative, reports that the Stewardship Committee is recommending cancelling the contract with the American Church Company for the distribution of weekly offering envelopes that are sent to about 80 members of the congregation. Offering envelopes will continue to be available on the "bulletin table" in the back of the sanctuary and Office Manager Becky Trover is happy to mail packets of these envelopes to anyone who wishes.

The annual cost for this service is about \$760 and not many people are using them, Warren reports.

Year to date giving statements and/or a letter from **Council President Wendy Stoica** was mailed in late August. It was decided to physically mail the statements/letters instead of emailing them because there had been challenges with the emailed versions going to spam.

The Annual Pledge Drive theme for this year is "Heart to Heart...Hand in Hand." The drive will kick off first with the Redeemer Lutheran Church Council and the full congregation drive will begin early October. The returned completed pledge cards will be blessed during the <u>October 30</u> church service. Thank you for your gifts to Redeemer Lutheran Church!

CMOA Exhibit Features Tapestries with Biblical Themes

The Columbus Museum of Art (CMOA) announced that its newest exhibition, *Raphael —The Power of the Renaissance Images: The Dresden Tapestries and Their Impact*, features six monumental tapestries depicting Biblical scenes. It is now open through **Sunday, October 30.**

The tapestries have never-before been exhibited in the U.S. and the Columbus Museum of Art is the only American venue for this exhibition.

These massive tapestries were created from the same Raphael paintings as the world-famous versions that were woven in the 16th century to hang in the Sistine Chapel and depict -- in monumental scale and grand detail -- a Biblical moment in the lives of St. Peter and St. Paul. A second set of the tapestries were woven at the Mortlake Tapestry Manufactory outside London. This second set of tapestries was taken to Germany in the 18th century and now, for the first time ever in the United States, these tapestries will be on view at CMOA, loaned by the Old Masters Gallery of Dresden.

The museum strongly encourages weekday visits when the exhibition will be quieter and less crowded and welcomes visitors to extend their visit and enjoy the café and sculpture garden after exploring the museum.
