Dedicated Volunteers Make Food Giveaway Possible

"Neither [cold] nor rain nor heat ..." is not only a creed for postal workers, it could also be applied to the crew of 20+ Redeemer members and friends who month in and month out man the food giveaway out on the parking lot. They have literally given away tons of fresh produce and other food items to thousands of neighbors and community members over approximately 10 years in conjunction with Lutheran Social Services (LSS) and the Mid-Ohio Food Collective.

Each month for seven months a year — April through October — Redeemer receives a delivery of approximately a ton of food which the volunteers then calculate how to divide it up among those they anticipate will drive through the giveaway. The drive-through protocol was devised to keep the giveaway going through the pandemic and continues to be used.

Kathy Zwanziger explained that they do not know ahead of time what items will be delivered, noting that perhaps the most unusual item was 1,400 pounds of garlic. And perhaps the most popular were the Cheryl's cookies that they received to distribute. However, the focus of the giveaway is to bring fresh produce out to neighborhoods.

Redeemer also supplements the food with items that can't be purchased with food stamps such as paper and cleaning products and personal care items, among other things.

This year, the highest number served was 691 individuals in May, with October being the second highest month with 583 individuals served.

While each month sees approximately 20 volunteers, they come from a group of 43 committed individuals of all ages, Redeemer members and friends. Thanks to everyone who makes this ministry possible! RLC's House Meetings Raise Number of Issues

Attendees at Redeemer's two BREAD house meetings shared their justice role models, struggles from the global pandemic, and concerns about mold, the environment or other issues from the BREAD roadmap. Lots of people had stories about a range of problems that stemmed from mold, from health concerns to being priced out of housing.

Reports were given on the progress that has been made on some of the seven issues on the roadmap (Environmental justice, "Stop Violence! Build Trust!", "Families First and Housing Now!", juvenile justice, municipal ID, jobs and elder care).

Now focus shifts to reminding all the Network Members and anyone else who is interested to plan to attend the Annual Assembly on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 15</u>. Normally, the Annual Assembly is the time to vote on a new issue for the roadmap from the concerns that were raised at the House Meetings. However, this year, nothing will be added as there are already so many items actively being worked on.

Instead, the 2022 Annual Meeting will be a "Mini Nehemiah Action." Some elected officials have already committed to be there. BREAD is hoping for a big in person turnout on November 15 at 7 p.m. at Christ the King Catholic Church on Livingston Ave.

Mission Endowment Fund Seeks Suggestions for 2022 Distribution

Every year the congregation donates a percentage (4 percent) of the year-end market value of the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) to other charities on behalf of the congregation. The 2022 3rd quarter market value was \$123,400 which would provide \$4,936 for distribution, **Dave Engel**, chair of the Special Funds Teams (SFT) reports. "The final amount may increase or decrease depending on the fourth quarter value.

The guidelines for distribution, as established in the constitution; to establish/support ministries of outreach on behalf of the congregation, and to further partnerships in mission through the synod and other arms of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Some prior recipients include LSS Food Pantry, Lutheran Memorial Camp/HopeWood Pines, Bishop Griffin Resource Center, Mid-Ohio Food Co-operative, Grace Missions Inc, Haiti, Lutheran Social Services, Renewed Strength Zambia, Ronald McDonald House, WELS Youth Leadership Program, and Groveport Special Olympics.

SFT is seeking suggestions for the use of the funds for 2022. Please use the **pink** form found at the end of *Reflections* or on a table in the Narthex to nominate possible recipients.

Complete it and place it in the Sunday offering plate or leave it in the church office. Suggestions are due by **Sunday**, **November 27**.

The SFT will then make its recommendation to council for action by the congregation at the Annual Meeting in January.

Update from Church Council

Church Council President Wendy Stoica reports, "The church has been staffing a nursery attendant since worship services returned in-person but we find that few families or children are using this service. We believe this is a positive sign that children are welcome in worship, however, it is a concern about whether we should continue paying for a weekly attendant.

"Beginning in November we will discontinue the paid nursery attendant for Sunday worship understanding that the nursery room is always available for parents to utilize. We will schedule a nursery attendant for special services (Christmas, Easter) and rely on feedback from families to ensure we remain a welcoming congregation for young children.

"Council continues to discuss evolving changes with making members and visitors feel safe within the building. Beginning next <u>Sunday</u>, <u>October 30</u> the sanctuary will return to mask-optional during worship. We encourage the congregation to continue sharing feedback with us.

"The 2023 budget preparation is in high gear. A final draft will be available for the congregation in early January. We will schedule opportunities to meet as a group to review and discuss questions prior to the Annual Meeting."

Update on Kathy Z's Health Journey

Kathy Zwanziger reports on the latest updates regarding her health journey: "My initial kidney transplant evaluation was <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 21</u> – but it was only the beginning of an evaluation as a potential kidney transplant recipient. Besides meeting with a nurse coordinator, my support person and I met with a doctor who asked lots of questions of me and answered many of my questions. I need to get clearance from all my doctors (including my dentist), have an appointment with a transplant social worker, and speak with a dietitian.

"My appointment concluded with the drawing of approximately 20 vials of blood and a chest x-ray. If all these conditions can be met within 90 days, the transplant team will debate the suitability of a kidney transplant. If the answer is positive, it was emphasized that a living donor would greatly reduce the amount of wait time, from three to five years to several months.

"Thank you for joining me in this journey."
