

**Isaiah 11:1-10** (Contemporary English Version, adapted and inclusivized)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Like a branch that sprouts from a stump, someone from David's family will someday rule. The Spirit of the Lord will be with this leader to give understanding, wisdom, and insight. This leader, whose greatest joy will be to obey the Lord, will be powerful, will know and honor the Lord, This leader won't judge by appearances or listen to rumors. The poor and the needy will be treated with fairness and with justice. The word of this leader will be law everywhere in the land, and a breath from this leader will slay the wicked. Honesty and fairness will be royal robes. Leopards will lie down with young goats, and wolves will rest with lambs. Calves and lions will eat together and be cared for by little children. Cows and bears will share the same pasture; their young will rest side by side. Lions and oxen will both eat straw. Little children will play near snake holes. ### Gospel

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord.

Years [after Jesus and his family moved to Nazareth], John the Baptist started preaching in the desert of Judea. He said, "Repent! The beloved community will soon be here."

John was the one the prophet Isaiah was talking about, when he said,

"In the desert someone is shouting,

'Get the road ready for the Lord!

Make the Lord a straight path."

John wore clothes made of camel's hair. He had a leather strap around his waist and ate grasshoppers and wild honey.

From Jerusalem and all Judea and from the Jordan River Valley crowds of people went to John. They told how sorry they were for their sins, and he baptized them in the river.

Many Pharisees and Sadducees also came to be baptized. But John said to them:

"You bunch of snakes! Who warned you to run from the coming judgment? Do something to show you have really given up your sins. And don't start telling yourselves that you belong to Abraham and Sarah's family. I tell you that God can turn these stones into children for Abraham and Sarah. An ax is ready to cut the trees down at their roots. Any tree that doesn't produce good fruit will be chopped down and thrown into a fire.

"I baptize you with water so you will give up your sins. But someone more powerful is going to come, and I am not good enough even to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His threshing fork is in his hand, and he is ready to separate the wheat from the husks. He will store the wheat in a barn and burn the husks in a fire that never goes out."




Jesus invited all who were hungry for food, healing, justice, and joy to share this communion meal. Since this is his meal, and he is present to us in it, all are welcome.




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### **Great Thanksgiving**



- This is the table of Emmanuel -- God-with-us. This is the place where bread and wine remind us how to live and love as those who inhabit God's time, and work to build God's Beloved Community. This is the place where we recognize that the one for whom we wait is also the one who is already, and always, here with us.
- So come! Whether you are watching for the dawn, or dreading first light, whether you are waiting with hope, or hiding your face, come with quiet confidence. Here Emmanuel watches for our coming, and waits with love and joy to welcome us in.
- The story of Emmanuel is the story of God waiting to inhabit time, who took on flesh and form, and lived among us, so that we might re-imagine life. It is the story of Jesus waiting to be betrayed, who shared supper with his friends, where he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take this and eat. This is my body, broken for you. Do this to remember me." And after supper he took the cup and gave it to them, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood. It is shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this to remember me."
- And so, taking this bread and wine, we remember and celebrate the waiting which began to change the world; and we join our voices with all who still wait and work for that change to come to completion:


### Lord's Prayer

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




