# 'When Did We See You?' – Hearing from Those Who Minister with the 'Least of These'

One of the best-known stories about Jesus comes from the end of the Gospel of Matthew. In the role of judge, Jesus welcomes a group of people into the beloved community God has prepared for them. Why are they so welcomed? "I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger, and you welcomed me, I was naked, and you gave me clothing, I was sick, and you took care of me, I was in prison, and you visited me" (Matthew 25:35-36). This explanation is clear as mud to the people Jesus is talking to, and they tell Jesus that. So Jesus unpacks it: "When you did it to the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me." In other words, when you make friends with people respectable folks don't think it's important to get to know, you're making friends with Jesus.

Starting November 13, at 11:15 a.m. in Room 2, the Sunday morning adult education program will welcome people who work for organizations that do exactly what Jesus is talking about. We will hear from people who walk alongside those on the margins so we might know more about the realities these neighbors face, what their lives are like, what these organizations are doing, and how any of us who wish might explore these ministries. So often we hear of struggles people have, and feel like they're too complex or too big for us to do anything; we feel overwhelmed. This class will offer an alternative way to respond.

I'm still waiting to hear back from several speakers, so the calendar is incomplete. This is the schedule so far:

Sunday, November 13: Karen Hjelm from the Mid-Ohio Worker's Association (MWA) will be joined by volunteer and Redeemer member Elyce Herring. Karen writes, "MWA is an all-volunteer, private membership association of part-time, temporary and service workers. Since 2001, our members have developed a self-help benefit program through a members-helping-members approach including emergency and supplemental food and clothing, preventive medical, nonemergency dental care and legal advice. We have advocates who fight to stop utility shutoffs and evictions. These benefits enable our members to have stability, unite with allies from all walks of life – professionals, students, office workers, small businesses and others – so that we can organize to change the root cause of the problem: poverty and the policies that create it."

Sunday, November 20: Rev. Kathi Herington, a retired Methodist pastor who is now active at Christ United Methodist Church in Berwyn, will speak about Kindway. Kindway is a Christian ministry that walks alongside incarcerated men and women, and those returning to life in the Columbus area after their release from prison. The organization's mission is "Empowering People, Restoring Hope, Honoring God." Kathi hopes to bring a woman she's worked with who will talk about her personal experiences in prison and how Kindway has helped her live well on the outside. Kathi will bring some polymer clay jewelry made by men and women inside for sale to the community. The proceeds help fund the needs of the

# Redeemer's Worship Team Seeks Feedback via Survey

The Worship Team would like to hear from members of the congregation by Thanksgiving regarding **two issues** surrounding Sunday morning worship.

First is the question of Redeemer's worship schedule and the ways folks worship with the Redeemer community. The second area deals with personal safety at the church.

Before COVID, during the school year, Redeemer worshipped Sunday mornings at 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m., with an education hour between services. During the summer, there would be one service. The year before the pandemic (2019), the average attendance for the 8:30 a.m. service was 36; the average for the 11 a.m. service was 62, with the average attendance for both services being 98 people.

Redeemer returned to in-person worship on Easter Sunday 2021. Except for Easter 2021 and 2022, the church has had one 10 a.m. service. The average in-person attendance in 2021 was 46; average livestream was 8; average YouTube viewership over the next week was 42; average YouTube viewership over the next 30 days was 68. So, total average attendance and viewership in 2021 was 122 (in-person + livestream + views within 30 days).

Through July 17, 2022, the average in-person attendance on Sundays is 58; average livestream is 15; average YouTube viewership the first week is 33; average YouTube viewership over 30 days is 56. So, total average attendance and viewership so far in 2022 is 129.

### Mission Endowment Fund Seeks Suggestions for 2022 Distribution

Every year the congregation donates a percentage (4 percent) of the year-end market value of the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) to other charities on behalf of the congregation. The 2022 3rd quarter market value was \$123,400 which would provide \$4,936 for distribution, **Dave Engel**, chair of the Special Funds Teams (SFT) reports. "The final amount may increase or decrease depending on the fourth quarter value.

The guidelines for distribution, as established in the constitution; to establish/support ministries of outreach on behalf of the congregation, and to further partnerships in mission through the synod and other arms of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Some prior recipients include LSS Food Pantry, Lutheran Memorial Camp/HopeWood Pines, Bishop Griffin Resource Center, Mid-Ohio Food Co-operative, Grace Missions Inc, Haiti, Lutheran Social Services, Renewed Strength Zambia, Ronald McDonald House, WELS Youth Leadership Program, and Groveport Special Olympics.

SFT is seeking suggestions for the use of the funds for 2022. Please use the **pink** form found at the end of *Reflections* or on a table in the Narthex to nominate possible recipients.

Complete it and place it in the Sunday offering plate or leave it in the church office. Suggestions are due by **Sunday**, **November 27**.

The SFT will then make its recommendation to council for action by the congregation at the Annual Meeting in January.

# **RLC's House Meetings Raise Number of Issues**

Attendees at Redeemer's two BREAD house meetings shared their justice role models, struggles from the global pandemic, and concerns about mold, the environment or other issues from the BREAD roadmap. Lots of people had stories about a range of problems that stemmed from mold, from health concerns to being priced out of housing.

Reports were given on the progress that has been made on some of the seven issues on the roadmap (Environmental justice, "Stop Violence! Build Trust!", "Families First and Housing Now!", juvenile justice, municipal ID, jobs and elder care).

Normally, the Annual Assembly is the time to vote on a new issue for the roadmap from the concerns that were raised at the House Meetings.
