## The Birth of the Messiah is Foretold

Isaiah 9:2-6; 11:1-4a - New Revised Standard Version and Contemporary English Version, inclusivized

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined. For to us a child is born, to us a Son is given; and the government will be upon his shoulder. And his name shall be called, "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Sovereign, Prince of Peace." Like a branch that sprouts from a stump, someone from David's family will someday rule. The Spirit of the Lord will be with him to give understanding, wisdom, and insight. This ruler will be powerful, and will know and honor God. His greatest joy will be to obey God. This ruler won't judge by appearances or listen to rumors. The poor and the needy will be treated with fairness and with justice.

#### Luke 2:2-20 – Revised Standard Version

- In those days, a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be enrolled in their own city.
- And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his fiancée, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.
- And she gave birth to a son, her first-born, and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.
- And in the region [of Bethlehem] there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flocks by night. And an angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them, and they were filled with fear.
- And the angel said, "Fear not. For behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will be for all the people. For to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: You shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."
- And suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God, and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace to those who do God's will."
- When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which our God has made known to us." And they went with haste, and found Mary and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger.
- And when they saw it they made known the saying which had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart.
- And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

## Matthew 2:1-12 - The Message, adapted

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem village, Judah territory—this was during Herod's kingship—a band of scholars arrived in Jerusalem from the East. They asked around, "Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews? We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth. We're on pilgrimage to worship him."

- When word of their inquiry got to Herod, he was terrified—and not Herod alone, but most of Jerusalem as well. Herod lost no time. He gathered all the high priests and religion scholars in the city together and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"
- They told him, "Bethlehem, Judah territory. The prophet Micah wrote it plainly:

'It's you, Bethlehem, in Judah's land,

no longer bringing up the rear.

From you will come the leader

who will shepherd-rule my people, my Israel."

- Herod then arranged a secret meeting with the scholars from the East. Pretending to be as devout as they were, he got them to tell him exactly when the birth-announcement star appeared. Then he told them the prophecy about Bethlehem, and said, "Go find this child. Leave no stone unturned. As soon as you find him, send word and I'll join you at once in your worship."
- Instructed by the king, they set off. Then the star appeared again, the same star they had seen in the eastern skies. It led them on until it hovered over the place of the child. They could hardly contain themselves: They were in the right place! They had arrived at the right time!
- They entered the house and saw the child in the arms of Mary, his mother. Overcome, they kneeled and worshiped him. Then they opened their chests and presented gifts: gold, frankincense, myrrh.
- In a dream, they were warned not to report back to Herod. So they left for their own country by another road.

## **Great Thanksgiving**



Holy God, Mother and Father of all life, from the beginning of time your Spirit breathed light over darkness. You scattered stars in the heavens and raised up the mountains. You poured out great rivers and blessed the earth with life. You made humans in your image, and loved us in our brokenness and beauty. You promised to stay with us wherever we might go.

- In the winter of our longing, you came to the prophet Mary. Your Spirit met her, so together you could help make creation whole. She gave birth to Jesus, your beloved one. As he grew, and heard your call more clearly, he healed wounds. He blessed the lost and lonely with the gift of home. He showed hungry souls how they could follow him in love without fear. His presence in this meal offers the same gifts and power to us.
- Holy One, shine upon us as you shone upon the faithful Mary, trusting shepherds, and curious wise ones. Shine upon us as you have always given light to your people in the darkest times and places. Lit by the star over the manger, we raise our voices with saints and angels in this heavenly song:



- This season we kneel by the manger and sit around the table with Jesus' disciples. This season we see this beautiful baby and we see the adult Jesus whose courageous words and actions, threatened the powerful so much they let their fear silence him. Long after the holy night in Bethlehem, Jesus gathered with his friends in Jerusalem. He took bread, blessed it, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take and eat: This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me."
- After supper, he took a cup of wine, gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is the blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink this, do so to remember me."

We ask your Spirit to bless this meal. We gather with you at the manger and in the upper room, in the joy of this birth and the betrayal of that night. Come among us! We open ourselves to Jesus' presence in this meal and in each other. Fed by this meal, we will be his body given for the world you love. We promise to make these words come alive in us as we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
