

# 118th Congress Grows in Diversity, Sees Little Change in Religious Trends

In many respects, the new Congress is the most diverse in American history. It is the most racially and ethnically diverse to date and has a record number of women and openly lesbian, gay or bisexual members. When it comes to religion, however, the governing body has seen small shifts and has been mostly untouched by religious trends in the general public, including the increasing share of Americans who say they have no religious affiliation.

As Congress begins its 118th session, the Pew Research Center released data showing how members' demographic characteristics have changed over the decades. The data comes from CQ Roll Call, which surveys members about demographic information, the Congressional Research Service, members' official campaign websites, and other sources collected by Pew researchers.

Below is a collection of Pew's findings, analyzing the demographics of the 534 voting members who made up the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate as of **Tuesday, Jan. 3**.

**133** - The number of senators and representatives who are Black, Hispanic, Asian American, American Indian or Alaska Native. That number has doubled in the last two decades, up from 65 non-White members in 2003.

**28** - The percentage of female members in the 118th Congress. Women account for 153 of 540 voting and nonvoting members of Congress, a 59 percent increase from the 96 women who were serving in Congress a decade ago, though it remains far below women's share of the overall U.S. population.

**13** - The number of openly lesbian, gay or bisexual (LGBTQ+) members in Congress, the highest in U.S. history and a figure that has tripled in a decade. This number includes two senators and 11 members of the House of Representatives.

**88** - The percentage of voting members who identify as Christian, only a few points lower than in the late 1970s, when about 91 percent of members of Congress identified as Christian.

1 - The number of religiously unaffiliated members in the new Congress. That member is **Sen. Kyrsten Sinema**, independent of Arizona. Another 20 members are categorized as having unknown religious affiliations, most of whom declined to answer questions about their religious affiliation.

**80** - The percentage of racial and ethnic minority members in the new Congress who are Democrats. Twenty percent are Republicans.

**44** - The number of Republican women in the new Congress across both chambers. This is compared to 109 Democratic women across both chambers. The gender division between the two parties began to widen around the 1970s, and of the 261 women elected to the U.S. House in 1992 or later, over two-thirds have been Democrats.

**6.5** - The percent of U.S. adults overall who identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual, according to a 2021 Gallup survey. This is compared to the 2 percent of LGB members in Congress.

**63** - The percent of Americans who identify as Christian in the general population, down from 78 percent in 2007. About three-in-10 U.S. adults (29 percent) identify as religious "nones" – people who describe themselves as atheists, agnostics or "nothing in particular" when asked about their religious identity.

**99** - The percent of Congressional Republicans who say they are Christian. The same is true for 76 percent of Congressional Democrats. Democrats in Congress are less likely than Republicans to identify as Protestant (44 percent vs. 69 percent), but a greater share of Democrats than Republicans are Catholic (31 percent vs. 25 percent).

**3** - The number of Muslim Congress members; all are Democrats in the U.S. House. The current Congress also has 33 Jewish members, made up of 22 House Democrats, nine Senate Democrats, and two House Republicans.

**75** - The percent of Congress members who are White. This is compared to 59 percent of the overall U.S. population.

## Nominations Open for ELCA Commission on Church Governance

At the 2022 Churchwide Assembly, voting members adopted a memorial concerning restructuring the ELCA's governance. The assembly adopted 738-72 the following action:

• "To direct the Church Council to establish a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church comprised of leaders of diverse representation from all three expressions that, working in consultation with the Conference of Bishops and the Church Council, shall reconsider the statements of purpose for each of the expressions of this church, the principles of its organizational structure, and all matters pertaining thereunto, being particularly attentive to our shared commitment to dismantle racism, and will present its findings and recommendations to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in preparation for a possible reconstituting convention to be called under the rules for a special meeting of the Churchwide Assembly."

The Church Council discussed this churchwide assembly action at its November 2022 meeting and authorized establishing the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) to consist of no more than 35 voting members and directed the Executive Committee of the Church Council to initiate the process of forming the commission.

The nomination process is open until <u>Thursday, March 9, 2023</u>. More information about the commitment and expectation of serving on the CRLC can be found online at



<u>https://tinyurl.com/y2mk5m6p</u>. Interested individuals who wish to be nominated or to nominate another person should complete and submit the nomination form.

The Executive Committee of the ELCA Church Council will serve as the nominating committee and will present a slate of nominees to the Church Council at its April 20, 2023 meeting for appointment to the CRLC.
