Results of RLC's Worship Survey



The results of the safety portion of the survey will appear in *Reflections* in a couple of weeks.


The first set of data was filled out by people who were primarily attending worship in-person.

1. How happy are you with having one 10 am service?






2. What is your preference in terms of a worship schedule?

The final blessing of Redeemer's new Service of Lenten Evening Prayer is a traditional prayer of Palestinian Christians:

Let your peace rain upon us, O living God of peace. Let your peace rain upon us, Lord, fill our hearts with your peace.

RLC Collecting Items for LWR Personal Care Kits

As the death toll from the earthquake and aftershocks in Turkey and Northern Syria continues to climb, Lutheran World Relief (LWR) has sent quilts, personal care kits, baby care kits, heating stoves, tents, and other critically needed supplies to trusted local partners in the affected areas, **Julianne Johnson** reports. This is possible because of ongoing efforts to prepare quilts and kts by Lutheran churches on a regular basis so that a supply is on hand when disaster strikes.

Redeemer has in the past sent personal care kits, and in response to the earthquake the congregation will do so again. "I am setting a goal of 75 personal care kits, and a challenge goal of 100 personal care kits," she added. The followings items are needed:

- 1. Light weight bath size towels maximum size 52" x 20" (light or medium weight towels are easier to hang dry!)
- 2. Bars of soap equaling 8-9 ounces in original packaging.
- 3. Adult toothbrushes.
- 4. **Sturdy** combs.
- 5. Metal nail clippers.

Please avoid items with religious symbols or messages or the camouflage, military symbols or American flag. No additional items will be included. For those who prefer to give money, it will be used to complete kits. Any balance will be sent to LWR for shipping costs. "We will collect these items throughout Lent. Thank you!"

Ads Win Again in RLC's 'Souper Bowl'

Thanks to all who contributed to Redeemer's Souper Bowl offering to benefit Lutheran Social Services Food Pantry! There were 38 cans of soup along with some cans of beans and jars of peanut butter which will be delivered to the pantry.

Kathy Zwanziger reports that the Kansas City Chiefs "collected" \$53 and the Philadelphia Eagles, \$148, in addition to all that soup. The winner, however, was "Mr. Peanut" and all the other commercials with a total of \$626. That means Redeemer will be contributing \$827 to the Food Pantry!

Spotlight on BREAD Network Member Al Rider

Kristi Hildebrand reports that BREAD Network Members were asked to answer a handful of questions. The last of their answers are being shared in Reflections. Here is the latest installment featuring **Al Rider**.

- 1. **What is your name?** "Alan' is what my mother named me because she liked it. But I've gone by 'Al' since middle school when **Al Kaline**, the Detroit Tigers all-star, was my baseball hero. Crazy thing ... His son later married my cousin in Detroit, so in a way, I became family with the guy I admired as a kid. How about that?"
- 2. What issues keep you up at night? "Lots of them. The degrading of our environment is one. Flagrant dishonesty in public life is another The brutal bullying by social groups in power over others who are not is a third, and that spreads out in all directions: gender suppression, wealth vs. poverty, racism, intellectual class, etc. etc. We are all One in Christ Jesus. Why can't we act like it?"
- 3. Why did you join the Justice team at Redeemer? "I've always felt called by the Gospel to stand up and be counted in the Church's prophetic mission on behalf of people and the planet, which are under attack by forces of greed and self-justification that we usually label as 'sin.' It's a life-long struggle to wrestle with the 'sin' in myself and in our culture."
- 4. **What is your favorite kind of bread?** "Since living in Germany years ago, I'm tied between German 'Brötchen' breakfast rolls and the honey-wheat communion bread recipe from the monks at the Trappist monastery in Virginia."
- 5. Why did you decide to become a Network Member of BREAD? "Number one, Pastor Dave asked me to. But number two, I'm strongly motivated to make a difference for my kids and grandkids by championing the environment of God's creation, and that's really what did it."
- 6. What is your Justice prayer for 2023? "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with me."

Webcasting is hopefully here to stay! When I can't attend on Sunday, I can catch up later.


Not sure if here is the place, but adult class right after service is detrimental to fellowship.

Responses from people who usually attend worship virtually:


1. What is your preference in terms of a worship schedule?

I prefer this time


Takes too long to get going in the morning. We are old.

Other comments

It seems to me that worship at Redeemer has been evolving to be more about us (our actions and feelings) and less about the good news of the in-breaking of God's commonwealth. (Oddly enough, the aspects of worship that I find least helpful - the creed and the Psalm - are about the only parts of the service that haven't been changed.) The content and style of worship is part of why I'm less motivated to attend, though the schedule doesn't help.

Worship Team discussed the responses at its meeting in January. "We had 45 online responses and three hard-copy responses from people who worship mostly in-person. Of those, almost 90 percent said they were 'very likely' to continue coming if we keep the single 10 a.m. schedule. Of the 10 respondents who usually attend virtually, five prefer the current schedule and four prefer an 8:30 and 11 a.m. schedule. A number of you mentioned how much you like it worshiping together at the same time with a good number of people in the sanctuary. We also understand that for some of you, the current schedule isn't your preference. Some of you have found ways to make it work. For others, it simply doesn't.

"As we talked about your responses, we have decided to keep our one 10 a.m. worship schedule. The vast majority of you have said you're very likely to continue attending if we keep our current schedule. The number of worship leaders, ushers, and communion preparers it takes to offer two different services, and how that changes the feel of worship from a vital size to two small services, leads us to decide to keep our current single 10 a.m. service. We wish we could meet everyone's preferences, but we know that isn't possible.

"On Easter, we will worship at 8:30 and 11 a.m., with an Easter brunch between services. If enough people offer to help, we plan to bring the monthly Healing Prayer service back in Lent. Please continue to share your experiences with us. We are grateful for your openness, patience, and flexibility as we asked you to worship in a variety of ways. Thank you!"

An Update from Kathy Z

Kathy Zwanziger periodically provides an update of her journey with dialysis. Here is the latest: "Being able to eat a wider range of foods now is great – except I take about two bites and really don't want to eat any more. Having 2,000 ml of extra fluid in me stifles the appetite. However, since I lose several grams of protein with each exchange, I need to eat to replace that protein.

"There are various types of dialysis: hemodialysis (a machine filters waste out of the blood) and peritoneal dialysis, which I chose. Four times daily I drain the fluid from my peritoneum (which has been "dwelling" there for at least two hours) and exchange it for a new bag of a special sugar solution. Somehow this fluid attracts waste products that the kidneys are unable to remove. The process is based on gravity, so nothing highly unusual.

"Theoretically, I can plan the four daily exchanges to fit my life but frequently it seems I am planning my life to fit the exchange schedule. Is it tedious going through 25 steps four times a day? Yes, but it is helping my body continue to function. However, I am looking forward to the next step -- part of the equipment necessary for that has already been delivered. Stay tuned!"

Nominations Open for ELCA Commission on Church Governance

At the 2022 Churchwide Assembly, voting members adopted a memorial concerning restructuring the ELCA's governance. The assembly adopted 738-72 the following action:

• "To direct the Church Council to establish a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church comprised of leaders of diverse representation from all three expressions that, working in consultation with the Conference of Bishops and the Church Council, shall reconsider the statements of purpose for each of the expressions of this church, the principles of its organizational structure, and all matters pertaining thereunto, being particularly attentive to our shared commitment to dismantle racism, and will present its findings and recommendations to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in preparation for a possible reconstituting convention to be called under the rules for a special meeting of the Churchwide Assembly."

The Church Council discussed this churchwide assembly action at its November 2022 meeting and authorized establishing the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) to consist of no more than 35 voting members and directed the Executive Committee of the Church Council to initiate the process of forming the commission.

The nomination process is open until <u>Thursday, March 9, 2023</u>. More information about the commitment and expectation of serving on the CRLC can be found online at https://tinyurl.com/y2mk5m6p. Interested individuals who wish to be nominated or to nominate another person should complete and submit the nomination form. The Executive Committee of the ELCA Church Council will serve as the nominating committee and will present a slate of nominees to the Church Council at its April 20, 2023 meeting for appointment to the CRLC.
