

**Reading** Romans 8:32-39 (The Inclusive New Testament) A reading from St. Paul's letter to the church at Rome

And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.



#### Adult Ed Led by Pastor Al Rider Sundays in August = 11:15 am


