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

## **WE PROCLAIM THE WORD**

**Reading** Exodus 20:1-4, 7-20 (New Living Translation, inclusivized) A reading from the book of Exodus

God gave the people these instructions:

- "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery.
- "You must not have any other god but me.
- "You must not make for yourself an idol of any kind or an image of anything in the heavens or on the earth or in the sea.
- "You must not misuse the name of the LORD your God. The LORD will not let you go unpunished if you misuse that name.
- "Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. You have six days each week for your ordinary work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath day of rest dedicated to the Lord your God. On that day no one in your household may do any work. This includes you, your children, your servants, your livestock, and any foreigners living among you. For in six days the Lord made the heavens, the earth, the sea, and everything in them; but on the seventh day God rested. That is why the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and set it apart as holy.
- "Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you.
- "You must not murder.
- "You must not commit adultery.
- "You must not steal.
- "You must not testify falsely against your neighbor.
- "You must not covet your neighbor's house. You must not covet your neighbor's spouse, servant, ox or donkey, or anything else that belongs to your neighbor."

May we listen for what the Spirit is saying to the church.

Gospel Matthew 21:33-46 (Contemporary English Version)

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus told the chief priests and leaders to listen to this story:

A land owner once planted a vineyard. He built a wall around it and dug a pit to crush the grapes in. He also built a lookout tower. Then he rented out his vineyard and left the country.

When it was harvest time, the owner sent some servants to get his share of the grapes. But the renters grabbed those servants. They beat up one, killed one, and stoned one of them to death. He then sent more servants than he did the first time. But the renters treated them in the same way.

Finally, the owner sent his own son to the renters, because he thought they would respect him. But when they saw the man's son, they said, "Someday he will own the vineyard. Let's kill him! Then we can have it all for ourselves." So they grabbed him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him.

Jesus asked, "When the owner of that vineyard comes, what do you suppose he will do to those renters?"

The chief priests and leaders answered, "He will kill them in some horrible way. Then he will rent out his vineyard to people who will give him his share of grapes at harvest time."

Jesus replied, "You surely know that the Scriptures say,

'The stone the builders
tossed aside
is now the most important
stone of all.
This is something
the Lord has done,
and it is amazing to us.'

I tell you God's kingdom will be taken from you and given to people who will do what God demands. Anyone who stumbles over this stone will be crushed, and anyone it falls on will be smashed to pieces."

When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard these stories, they knew Jesus was talking about them. So they looked for a way to arrest Jesus. But they were afraid to, because the people thought he was a prophet.

We will continue to take a moment to greet those who are worshiping via livestream before greeting those in the sanctuary.




# **WE SHARE HOLY COMMUNION**

And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.



Deadline to Register to Vote: October 10.

Early In-Person Voting: Begins October 11 and includes the Saturday and Sunday before Election Day (but NOT the Monday before Election Day).

Absentee Voting By Mail: Begins October 11.

Deadline for absentee ballot applications to be received by county Boards of Elections: October 31.

Deadline to postmark your mail ballot: November 6.

Election Day: November 7 (Polls Open 6:30 a.m. 7:30 p.m.)

Deadline for mail ballots to be personally delivered to your County Board of Elections: November 7, 7:30 PM.

Deadline for boards to receive mail-ballots that have been postmarked on or before November 6: November 11.
