

ELCA Bishop Eaton Addresses Mideast Crisis

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?" Psalm 22:1

Dear church,

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a just-announced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families. their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.

It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people - through the occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence - must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so. P.S. Things you can do:

Highlights of September Congregational Council Meeting

Attendees at the <u>Monday, September 18</u> meeting included Pastor Dave Shull, President Michele Disbro, Vice President Krista Skipper, Nathan Ott, Katie Jacobs, Jennifer Young, Diane Brobeck, Elyce Herring, Sue Yehling, Laura Warren and Sue Watson.

The meeting began at 7:05 p.m. with an opening devotion from Pastor Dave provided a recording of The Lord's Prayer in Swahili (baba yetu, YouTube).

After asking for feedback on how we are living into our mission, vision and values, Michele and Laura led a lively discussion of Sunday's Celebrations (church anniversary, ministry volunteers, choir celebration, and the dedication of the new basketball hoops). It was unanimously agreed that the event was very successful and should become an annual event.

The August 21 minutes were approved unanimously. Also, an electronic vote had been taken since the last meeting, after the Executive Team approved the replacement of the AC unit for the educational wing at a cost of \$19,575.

The Financial Reports were approved with Nate commenting that there has been a trend of having one month with higher income and the next month with a lower income. The month of August was a lower income month. Also, typically the end of the year shows an increase in income. The net operating through August is actually looking pretty good considering a deficit was projected.

The Ministry reports were also reviewed.

Greg Ruban's updates to the Financial Process Audit Report were reviewed in detail, and it was noted by Michele that current **Treasurer Julie Johnson** has requested that both a treasurer and a backup be appointed for next year. Also, credit card limits were reduced from \$29,000 to \$15,000.

The Safety Team (**April Smith, Sara Auman** and **Sue Yehling**) have prepared a brochure. Council unanimously moved to approve its use. The intent is to place the brochure in each of the pews, on the Kiosk in the Narthex, among other locations. Also discussed was the need to provide them to regular users of Redeemer's space, i.e., Suzuki, Berwick Civic Association, Girl Scouts, etc.

Council was reminded that the next meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. on <u>Monday, October 16</u>, immediately before the RLC Ministry Evaluation at 7 p.m. **Marques Highland** is preparing a form for council and mutual ministry team members to complete and return to him so he can compile the responses for this meeting.

Council also approved the Facility Use Request to use the Fellowship Hall by Thomas Mitchell (basketball assistant coach) on Nov 23 for a family Thanksgiving dinner.

Michele again reminded Council that budgets are the current focus. Nate will need those numbers soon.

After the Lord's Prayer, the meeting was adjourned.

Early Voting Underway

Early in-person and absentee voting by mail for the <u>November 7</u> is now underway. Hours for early, in-person voting at local county boards of elections are as follows:

- Monday, October 16-Friday, October 20, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

- Monday, October 23-Friday, October 27, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Monday, October 30- Friday, November 3, 7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m.
- Saturday, November 4, 8 a.m.- 4 p.m.
- Sunday, November 5, 1-5 p.m.

- Election Day Tuesday, November 7 polls will be open 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Voters may also choose to vote by mail. Information about requesting an absentee ballot can be found online at VoteOhio.gov. The deadline for absentee ballot applications to be received by the local board of elections is **Tuesday, October 31**. Absentee ballots must be post marked by Monday, November 6 or delivered directly to the local board of elections by 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, November 7.

Once their ballot request is received by their county board of elections, voters may track their ballot at <u>http://VoteOhio.gov/Track</u>. As long as a ballot is postmarked by the day before the election, <u>Monday</u>, <u>November 6</u>, and received by Saturday, November 11, the vote will be tabulated.



Ohio voters will find two issues on their ballot this election: State Issue 1 is the reproductive/abortion rights constitutional amendment while State Issue 2 is an initiated law legalizing recreational use of marijuana. Also on this ballot are local elected offices.
