Deadline for Advent Devotional Entries Is Nov. 13



Sheryl Owens reports that Redeemer's book group will be discussion *This Land Is Our Land: An Immigrant's Manifesto* by Suketu Mehta at its meeting on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>January 17</u>, <u>2024</u> at 7 p.m.

She writes, "Mehta's forte is not mincing words or verbal diplomacy. He does not sugar coat his perspective; in fact, he rips off the bandage and throws alcohol on the wound left behind and then douses you with an ice water bath. This is either refreshing, or startlingly shocking, but it is not boring. You immediately feel his frustration and anger.... and hope.

"You may have heard it before, but this is not a whisper. It is a migrant's tale, and a minority tale. It is an economic tale since migrants and immigrants have all been touched by this saga. However, some have been able to rise above it because they could and chose to blend in.

"I was going to include a quote from this book, but choosing just one is like eating one Lays potato chip. Instead, I'll just invite you to read this book, and join the discussion: ... I believe there is something for everyone on this journey."

Bishop Eaton to Take 4-6 Month Sabbatical

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Church (ELCA) this past week announced that the Council Executive Committee had approved **Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton's** request for a four-to-six-month leave of absence. Her leave starts **Friday, November 17**.

"The Church Council appointed **Rev. Michael Burk**, former bishop of the Southeastern Iowa Synod, as presiding bishop pro tem to care for the responsibilities of the presiding bishop during her leave of absence.

"We give thanks for Bishop Eaton's tireless dedication and leadership and pray for her during this time of rest and rejuvenation."

Redeemer's guest pastor Sunday, **Rev. Emlyn Ott**, reported that she had been in touch with the bishop and that, after nine years in that position, this is the first sabbatical she has had.

First English Update

Kay Ernsthausen writes, "It's been awhile since I gave an update on First English. So here are somethings happening and changing:

- **Pastor Lorin Darst** is the new pastor at First English.
- "Due to some volunteers' being called to another church, the Thursday night dinners will be suspended for the foreseeable future. However, they are still doing the Sunday morning breakfast, and according to some regulars, the best one in town. ... Sunday morning breakfast is a show up at 7:15 -7:30 a.m. and help serve the breakfast that is brought in. The breakfast is done serving and cleaned up at 9 a.m. The church currently has enough providers of breakfast. However, the church doing food on the third Sunday of the month can use some help serving. If anyone would like to do this, let me know and I will connect you with the Sunday meal coordinator.
- "A second option is to collect food and put together a brown bag lunch. These are handed out at the Sunday morning breakfast. The brown bag can be what we make it as long as it's a balanced meal. One suggestion was a PB&J sandwich, a meat and cheese sandwich, a bag of chips, a soft/chewy granola bar, some kind of fruit or fruit cup, a dessert like cookies or HoHo's. Part of this is very much like our Thursday night to go dinner. The lunches are given out as people leave the Sunday breakfast.

"If you would like to help with or feel we should do one of the above suggestions please let Kay know your preference or if you have another suggestion." Email her at KAErnsthausen@gmail.com and she will then bring it up with the staff at First English.

Prayer Concerns for Two Weeks from ELCA

- **14** Pray for youth and family ministry leaders in our congregations, and promise to express appreciation, support and encouragement for their work of faith formation and caring for young people and their parents.

- 16 "O God, to you I cry in pain when sickness makes me weak, when mind and body out of tune bring fears I cannot speak" (ACS 1021). We are never alone in times of distress. Praise God for being attentive to us through caring neighbors and siblings in Christ, especially when we find it difficult to express our infirmities and suffering.
- 17 Pray for the 800-plus rostered ministers who have responded to God's call to provide specialized pastoral care in ministries across the ELCA and in our communities, including hospice, counseling, corrections, long-term care, and police and fire chaplaincy.
- **18** Thank God for the ELCA's special relationship with The Episcopal Church, a full communion partner since 1999. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.
- 19 Thank God for the example of Jesus Christ, who guides our understanding of generosity, for the sake of the world and our neighbors at the margins of society.

- 20 Pray for the success of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service's Preferred Refugee Employer Program, which helps employers offer support and services of particular benefit to the refugees in their communities.
- 21 Pray for youth, parents, youth leaders and congregations registering for the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering. Ask the Spirit to stir their enthusiasm, guide their preparation for their experience in New Orleans, and help those who are discerning whether to participate.
- 22 Pray that our acts of generosity will come from a place of gratefulness to God and concern for our neighbor and will "produce thanksgiving to God through us" (2 Corinthians 9:11).
- 23 Thanksgiving Day "We lift our voices, we lift our hands, we lift our lives up to you: we are an offering, we are an offering" (ELW 692). Pray that we will see every aspect of our life as an offering for the sake of our neighbor and the well-being of the world -- an expression of thanksgiving for the blessings and resources that God has generously given to us.
- **24 Native American Heritage Day** Praise God for the rich and diverse legacies of Native American neighbors and siblings in Christ. Give thanks for the continuing influence of Indigenous cultures, traditions, spirituality, arts and concepts of community.
- 25 Remember in prayer neighbors and siblings in Christ who are without safety, shelter, food or basic social services. Promise to be tireless, creative and respectful in providing immediate and long-term care for those who are homeless, and in boldly advocating for just laws that yield appropriate and truly affordable housing.

 26 Pray that our concern, empathy and service for the well-being of our neighbors in need will be bold and boundless, especially when we are pressured to serve only select groups.
- 27 Remember in prayer pastors and their families, and pray that we will demonstrate our concern for their well-being and renewal through ongoing encouragement, support, affirmation and guidance.
