





#### Gospel

Mark 1:4-11 (The Message, adapted) Glory to you, O Lord. The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark

- John the Baptizer appeared in the wild, preaching a baptism of life-change that leads to forgiveness of sins. People thronged to him from Judea and Jerusalem and, as they confessed their sins, were baptized by him in the Jordan River into a changed life. John wore a camel-hair habit, tied at the waist with a leather belt. He ate locusts and wild field honey.
- As he preached he said, "Someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not even worthy to stoop down like a slave and untie the straps of his sandals. I'm baptizing you here in the river, turning your old life in for a kingdom life. His baptism—a holy baptism by the Holy Spirit—will change you from the inside out."
- At this time, Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. The moment he came out of the water, he saw the sky split open and God's Spirit, looking like a dove, come down on him. Along with the Spirit, a voice: "You are my Son, chosen and marked by my love, pride of my life."

The Gospel of the Lord

Praise to you, O Christ.

Please be seated

A mother holds her newborn child, gotten by pain and labor, helpless and incompetent. She loves her baby, not for its behavior, not for its deserving, but because love is her nature, loving fiercely, like a raging river. Her love is not determined by the child's performance but by her own heart. Ask her if the child is good enough and she will answer, "No. She is perfect. Because she's mine." There is no other reason, no variance.

You are a newborn child, fresh from God's birth waters. Your choices, though real, are immaterial to God's adoration.

You can never be good enough, for there is no such thing. It is God's goodness, not yours, that guarantees your belovedness.

Of course you are not deserving. You may protest, "But, God, I'm not all that good." God will reply, "Oh, child, you're so much worse than you know. But I love you. You are my child, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

> Get over being good enough, and your enemy being good enough. You are God's child, God's Beloved, with whom God is delighted.


We will continue to take a moment to greet those who are worshiping via livestream before greeting those in the sanctuary.





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### **Great Thanksgiving**



- In a refugee child playing under a star, in an unknown young man requesting baptism, in a wandering preacher refreshed by water from a woman's hand, God was waiting to be recognized and known, to transform seeing and change the world.
- In the routine smallness of everyday life, in the painful uncertainty of struggle and transition, in the timeless grace of hospitality, and the gifts of bread and wine, God is waiting to be recognized and known, to transform our seeing, and to change our world.
- Here, at this table, under the welcoming light of a morning star, the God of epiphanies waits to be encountered. So though you may be weary and worn by your journey or stained and sore with travel look up and see the star, lay aside your packs, and enter with joy for God waits here to refresh and renew, to comfort and restore, to challenge and transform, to know, and be known.
- Now, gathered around this table, we recall and recount how the Epiphany God appeared in the actions and words of Jesus as he shared a last supper with his friends in which Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take this and eat. This is my body, broken for you. Do this to remember me." And after supper, Jesus took the cup and gave it to them, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood. It is shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. As often as you drink this, do so to remember me."
- Recalling and treasuring these things, we join our voices with those of all creation to recognize and celebrate the grace and goodness of God present and at work in the world.



Epiphany God, send down your Holy Spirit now on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine – that we might recognize and know you present with us here, and in receiving the gifts of your love find ourselves renewed. By this meal, renew our commitment to make real the prayer Jesus teaches:

#### Lord's Prayer

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.




