#### **WE PROCLAIM THE WORD**

Reading

Romans 4:17-25 (The Message, alt.)

A reading from St. Paul's letter to the early church at Rome

We call Abraham our parent in faith not because he got God's attention by living like a saint, but because God made something out of Abraham when he was a nobody. Isn't that what we've always read in Scripture, God saying to Abraham, "I set you up as parent of many peoples"? Abraham was first named "parent" and then became a parent because he dared to trust God to do what only God could do: raise the dead to life, with a word make something out of nothing. When everything was hopeless, Abraham believed anyway, deciding to live not on the basis of what he saw he couldn't do but on what God said God would do. And so he was made parent of a multitude of peoples. God said to him, "You're going to have a big family, Abraham!"

Abraham didn't focus on his own impotence and say, "It's hopeless. This hundred-year-old body could never father a child." Nor did he survey Sarah's decades of infertility and give up. He didn't tiptoe around God's promise asking cautiously skeptical questions. He plunged into the promise and came up strong, ready for God, sure that God would make good on what God had said. That's why it is said, "Abraham was declared fit before God by trusting God to set him right." But it's not just Abraham; it's also us! The same thing gets said about us when we embrace and believe the One who brought Jesus to life when the conditions were equally hopeless. The sacrificed Jesus made us fit for God, set us right with God.

May we open ourselves to what the Spirit is saying to the church. Amen.



The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus began to teach his disciples: "The Human One must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and the legal experts, and be killed, and then, after three days, rise from the dead." He said this plainly. But Peter took hold of Jesus and, scolding him, began to correct him. Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, then sternly corrected Peter: "Get behind me, Satan. You are not thinking God's thoughts but human thoughts."

After calling the crowd together with his disciples, Jesus said to them, "All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross, and follow me. All who want to save their lives will lose them. But all who lose their lives because of me and because of the good news will save them. Why would people gain the whole world but lose their lives? "What will people give in exchange for their lives? Whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this unfaithful and sinful generation, will find, in turn, that the Human One and the holy angels will be ashamed of that person, when all stand before Our God in glory."



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
#### **Great Thanksgiving**

The gifts of God, for the people of God. Jesus welcomed all to this meal. So do we.



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#### **Prayer of Thanksgiving**




