





Ephesians 2:1-10 (The Message, alt.)

A reading from the letter to the early church at Ephesus

It wasn't so long ago that you were mired in that old stagnant life of sin. You let the world, which doesn't know the first thing about living, tell you how to live. You filled your lungs with polluted unbelief, and then exhaled disobedience. We all did it, all of us doing what we felt like doing, when we felt like doing it, all of us in the same boat. It's a wonder God didn't do away with the whole lot of us. Instead, immense in mercy and with an incredible love, God embraced us, and took our sin-dead lives and made us alive in Christ. God did all this with no help from us! Then God picked us up and set us down in highest heaven in company with Jesus, our Messiah.

Now we are where God wants us, with all the time in this world and the next to shower grace and kindness upon us in Christ Jesus. Saving is all God's idea, and all God's work. All we do is trust enough to let God do it. It's God's gift from start to finish! We don't play the major role. If we did, we'd probably go around bragging that we'd done the whole thing! No, we neither make nor save ourselves. God does both the making and saving. God creates each of us by Christ Jesus to join Jesus in the work he does, the good work he has gotten ready for us to do, work we had better be doing.

May we open ourselves to what the Spirit is saying to the church. Amen.

Great Thanksgiving


The Lord be with you.




