Procession with Palms

The Palm Sunday Procession dates back to fourth century Jerusalem. In the procession, everyone carries a palm branch so that ritually and symbolically, the church becomes Jerusalem for the time of this worship service, and Jesus again enters His city. The past becomes the present and the future is foreshadowed when Jesus will lead His people into the New Jerusalem, the heavenly city in which the Easter Celebration will find its fulfillment.

Gospel

Mark 11:1-11 (Common English Bible, inclusivized)

The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark

Glory to you, O Lord.

When Jesus and his followers approached Jerusalem, they came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives. Jesus gave two disciples a task, saying to them, "Go into the village over there. As soon as you enter it, you will find tied up there a colt that no one has ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'Its master needs it, and will send it back right away."

They went and found a colt tied to a gate outside on the street, and they untied it. Some people standing around said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them just what Jesus said, and they left them alone. They brought the colt to Jesus and threw their clothes upon it, and he sat on it. Many people spread out their clothes on the road while others spread branches cut from the fields. Those in front of him and those following were shouting,

"Hosanna! Please save!

Blessings on the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
Blessings on the coming reign of our ancestor David!
Hosanna in the highest!"

Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple. After he looked around at everything, because it was already late in the evening, he returned to Bethany with the Twelve.





WE PROCLAIM THE WORD

Reading

Philippians 2:5-11 (The Message, alt.)

A reading from St. Paul's letter to the early church at Philippi

Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of himself. He had equal status with God but didn't think so much of himself that he had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. Not at all. When the time came, he set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a slave, became human! Having become human, he stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, he lived a selfless, obedient life and then died a selfless, obedient death—and the worst kind of death at that—a crucifixion.

Because of that obedience, God lifted him high and honored him far beyond anyone or anything, ever, so that all created beings in heaven and on earth—even those long ago dead and buried—will bow in worship before this Jesus Christ, and every tongue proclaim to the glory of God: Jesus Christ reigns supreme!

May we open ourselves to what the Spirit is saying to the church. Amen.

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
Great Thanksgiving



We are right to praise you, faithful God! You answer sin with grace; you guide our wayward steps toward home. You are mending for the broken, friendship with the poor, and belonging for the outcast.

You reveal your kindness in every sorrow, your mercy even in death. All your creatures see your works; they sing your steadfast love.

We too declare your wonder and grace as with angels and saints we sing:

The gifts of God, for the people of God. Jesus welcomed all to this meal. So do we.


Please be seated

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
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Prayer of Thanksgiving


