## **New Orleans Bound!!**

By the time you read this article, Izzy, Sophie, and Andrew Skoog, Sachio and Toshi Phillips, Wendy Stoica and Dave Shull will be in our rented SUV on our

way to the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans. Google Maps tells us the shortest route is 916 miles – 13 hours and 2 minutes, not counting stops for meals and other necessities. The route will take us down the centers of Kentucky, Tennessee, and Alabama, before we head west into Mississippi and then into the Big Easy ... and into our beds at the Sheraton New Orleans Hotel on Canal Street.





The Youth Gathering officially begins Tuesday at 7 pm with the "mass gathering" at the Smoothie King Center. Smoothie King is the home of the National Basketball Association's New Orleans Pelicans. With over 19,000 youth expected at the Gathering, a sports arena is the only kind of venue that can hold us all.

That means we can sleep in on Tuesday and have a chance to ease into what is going to be a very full, stimulating, and exhausting-in-the-best-possible-way week. The Sheraton is right in the central business district, within walking distance

of the French Quarter and many other New Orleans landmarks. So there will be plenty of places to walk that look nothing like any part of Columbus. At some point on our first day, we'll find our way to a classic Cajun/Creole restaurant for an early dinner. Then we'll walk to

Smoothie King for the opening gathering.

## **RLC to Provide Garden Shed for Bishop Griffin Resource Center**

On April 15, the Adult Education class asked the director of the Bishop Griffin Resource Center (BGRC), **Nancy DeRoberts-Moore**, what Redeemer Lutheran Church could do to support their mission. She spoke of the need for a tool shed for their community garden, and the class responded with spirited discussion of possible costs and types of sheds.

The next week **Larry Trover** began working with **Marge Telerski**, coordinator of the community garden at BGRC, to see what we could do. After considering several sheds and sources, in May they decided on a 12' x 12' steel shed available from Menard's. Cost of the complete shed kit is \$1,250. Estimate for a concrete pad to put it on is \$1,250.

The theme for the Gathering is "Created to be ..."; each night's program ends that phrase in a different way: Tuesday: Created to be Brave; Wednesday: Created to be Authentic; Thursday: Created to be Free; Friday: Created to be Discuptive; and, for our closing Mass Gathering Saturday morning, Created to be Disciples. A wide variety of speakers will be leading each evening's program and worship, including 17-year-old **Rebekah Bruesehoff** whom we first met at the 2018 gathering in Houston. Rebekah is an LGBTQ rights activist, social media influencer, and author. As a child, Bruesehoff began attending protests with her mother; she became involved as a prominent supporter of transgender youth when the **Donald Trump** administration denied rights to trans students.

Each night after we get home from Smoothie King, any who wish can participate in opportunities for ELCA-sponsored "nightlife options" that take place right in the hotel.

Wednesday's program starts at 7:30 a.m. (which means our breakfast is before that!). Wearing our orange "Accompaniment Day" shirts and closed-toe shoes, we will spend the morning doing some kind of service activity in the city.

Thursday we will gather for a scavenger hunt through the French Quarter, hearing stories about the city and then wear our gray Southern Ohio Synod t-shirts for shared worship with all the churches in Region 6, almost 1,200 youth. Izzy and Toshi will lead a portion of the Synod day worship.

Friday morning will be our turn to enjoy the "Interactive Learning Center." This is a massive indoor extravaganza of opportunities for every possible area of interest. Youth will be able to explore whatever they want to, like HooDoo hammocks, giant ping pong, and storytelling. There are even quiet spaces for those who may feel a bit overstimulated after spending so much time together!

We'll track down **Jill Disbro**, who'll be in the center representing Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. Jill was recently ordained.

There's a lot of unstructured time so we can do some of our own exploring around what has to be one of the most unique and unusual cities in this country.

We'll head home Sunday and hope to arrive by 11 p.m. or so. Monday will undoubtedly be a day of rest for us all!

Your generous contributions to the brunch following January's congregational meeting and to the Easter brunch, your donations to and purchases at the June yard sale, and other financial assistance from Redeemer folks have supplemented what families of the youth going on the trip

# The Community Beyond

## **Gaza and Palestine Update**

**Julie Johnson** submitted the following update on Gaza and Palestine:

The *Lancet*, a respected medical journal, released a report estimating that at least 186,000 Palestinians have been killed so far in Gaza.

Some extended families have been nearly completely decimated by the war in Gaza – including one family that had 173 family members killed in December 2023. The death toll for that family alone now tops 270. There are hundreds of Palestinian families who have experienced over 25 deaths. To a degree never seen before, Israel is killing entire families. Grandparents, parents, children, uncles, aunts, cousins and more had often settled in the same areas to maintain close family ties. Even when evacuations from one area of Gaza would take place they would gather in new locations. Entire families are buried in mass graves, in hospital courtyards or beneath staircases in the homes where they were killed.

The U.S. pier built to deliver humanitarian aid to Gaza is now being dismantled after repeated problems due to weather, high seas, and security.



Humanitarian aid remains much lower than the needed amount, and aid that gets into Gaza is depends is unloaded into warehouses, and is dependant on trucks and drivers in Gaza to distribute.

Pray for peace -a just peace for all.
