(A poem-prayer by Ted Loder)

O God. Who out of nothing brought everything that is, out of what I am bring more of what I dream but haven't dared: direct my power and passion to creating life where there is death, to putting flesh of action on bare-boned intentions, to lighting fires against the midnight of indifference, to throwing bridges of care across canyons of loneliness; so I can look on creation together with you, and, behold, call it very good; through Jesus Christ my Lord.

As summer winds down and we gear up for a season of new efforts – at school, in church, in our country – it strikes me that this is a good season to dream.

Pastor Ted Loder's prayer from his book, Guerrillas of Grace: Prayers for the Battle, gives us poetic words with which we can live into our personal dreams. August 28 marks 61 years since Martin Luther King, Jr. stood in the shadow of the Lincoln Memorial and proclaimed his expansive dream of a nation that keeps its promises and fulfills its potential as he proclaimed "the fierce urgency of now."

In a quiet moment perhaps Ted Loder's prayer can help you to articulate your own dreams. And any search engine can take you to the text and the video of Martin Luther King's dream. Whether personally or corporately, whether in our own bodies, the body politic, or as the Body of Christ, this is not a good time to fall asleep, but it is a great time to dream!


To that end, Sister Act is inviting the congregation to donate any of the following items for the Care Kits:

- Small bottles of hand sanitizer


There is a box in the Narthex for the donations. Thank you for your help!!

Over the years Redeemer has found a variety of ways to help needy students and families at Berwick Alternative Elementary School. We've offered holiday baskets, provided school uniforms, and even sponsored two families with gift cards at Christmas one year. Redeemer has been generous!

Recently the Outreach Team connected with the school principal once again to see whether Redeemer might be of assistance. She shared that last year she had eight students in shelters and one family from Haiti, so the needs have been many. She also stressed that all of the church's previous efforts have been greatly appreciated.

A number of possible approaches for this year were discussed and it was concluded that the simplest way to help would be for Redeemer to hold on to any contributions and then let her refer any families in need directly to us. She was sure there would be requests for help with uniforms and other back-to-school costs.

So once again, "let's live into our mission and our values by supporting families in need at Berwick School. Any contributions should be designated for the Berwick School Fund, and just as a guide, **Dave** and **Joanie Engel** remember that uniforms cost about \$30 six years ago. So, since school is starting as you're reading this, let's try to be both generous and speedy."

Sunday Adult Ed Begins Sept. 8

The Sunday Adult Ed Forum resumes <u>September 8</u> with classes based on the book *Leading Causes of Life* by Gary Gunderson and Larry Pray although folks don't need to read the book to participate. **Pastor Brad** will examine the things that Gunderson and Pray insist actually *cause* life:

- Connection: Our capacity for interaction with all of creation.
- Coherence: Our ability to belong and find meaning.
- Agency: Our capacity to make things happen, even modestly.
- **Blessing:** Our capacity to care across generations.
- **Hope:** Our capacity to remember the future.



Pastor Brad writes, "I believe Jesus came to offer us abundant life. I believe God's mission is to redeem a languishing creation and restore to every corner of creation a sense of flourishing. That's why I'm all in with Gary Gunderson and his plea that we stop staring at our consumer culture and all its empty promises about how we can defy death. Let's refocus on the health practices that actually cause life."

Good Neighbors Picnic Set for Sept. 28 at Wolfe Park

The Good Neighbors Picnic will be held this year on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>September 28</u> at Wolfe Park on the east side of Columbus. Redeemer members and friends are invited to begin donating new or gently used blankets and cold weather clothing and accessories to help provide for unhoused brothers and sisters in the Columbus area. This all-day event was started in 1999 by Redeemer member **William McCulley** along with a few volunteers as part of the National Make a Difference Day. Volunteers are also needed.

On the day of the Good Neighbors Picnic, volunteers work to provide a day of celebration including food, music, games, books, family photos, crafts, and shopping at a Free Store for blankets and winter clothing. Last year individuals shopped the Free Store for items such as coats, blankets, winter clothes, shoes, socks, underwear, and personal hygiene items.

Men, women, and children of all ages from local shelters are transported to the park for this day of celebration and fun.

Redeemer, along with other faith organizations, community leaders, local businesses and organizations work to gather items for those who are unhoused or in shelters. Donations may be placed in the bin located in the Narthex. Cash donations or gift cards are welcome and may be dropped off at the church office.

We served 584 people, with 53 new families matching the number in July – as did the number of children: 191. There were 53 seniors. Julie Johnson reports, "Last year individuals at Redeemer joined many across the Southern Ohio Synod in pledging support through the synod's Thrive! campaign, which continues to fund several new resources of the SOS. Thrive! is a three-year campaign and Redeemer pledges totaled just over \$34,000!

"As of last month we have topped \$17,000 (combined last year and seven months of this year.) Each month we forward to the synod the amount received the previous month.

The Wider Church

Update on Palestine and Gaza

The following update is provided by Julianne Johnson:

"Ceasefire talks have resumed in Cairo and Hamas is sending a delegation. The United States has sent several key administrative personnel to the area. Israel has made what it termed a preemptive strike on Hezbollah in Lebanon, and Lebanon launched rockets and drones with bombs into Israel. It is also widely agreed that a ceasefire agreement must be reached if there is any possibility to avoid an Iranian military action against Israel. Iran has said that Israel will pay for the assassination of a Hamas leader who was visiting Tehran when he was killed.

Bombings and fighting continue in Gaza. Israel regularly calls for evacuations of parts of Gaza that was supposed to be a humanitarian zone. Sewage and water infrastructure were destroyed by Israel months ago so conditions for disease are rampant. Humanitarian aid remains far below needed levels, and aid trucks continue to be backed up in Egypt because of Israeli restrictions.

The acknowledged death toll now tops 40,000 in Gaza, although the actual casualties are considered to be much higher - some estimates now near 200,000. - or nearly 10 percent of the entire population of Gaza are now dead." Israel claims over 17,000 of the 40,000 deaths are militants, which means that 23,000 are civilians. Experts state that still means that 20,000 Hamas fighters remain. Netanyahu's stated goal is to eliminate Hamas – a goal that even the Israeli defense minister has said is unrealistic.

War with Iran would be a huge escalation of this fight, potentially involving the United States and other nations. Pray, and advocate for a ceasefire, return of hostages from both sides and justice for Palestinians.
