

Gospel John 11:46-48, 53; 12:1-8 (Inclusive New Testament)
The Holy Gospel according to St. John Glory to you, O Lord.

Some [of the people who saw Jesus raise Lazarus from the dead] went to the religious leaders and reported what Jesus had done. As a result, they called a meeting of the governing council. "What are we to do?" they said. "with this one who is performing all the miracles? If we let him go on like this, everybody will believe in him, and then the Romans will come and destroy both our temple and our nation." From that day they were determined to kill him.

Six days before Passover, Jesus went to Bethany, the village of Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they gave a banquet in Jesus' honor, at which Martha served. Lazarus was one of those at the table.

Mary brought a pound of costly ointment, pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus, wiping them with her hair. The house was full of the scent of the ointment.

Judas Iscariot, one of the disciples – the one who was to betray Jesus – protested, "Why wasn't this ointment sold? It could have brought nearly a year's wages, and the money been given to poor people!" Judas didn't say this because he was concerned for poor people, but because he was a thief. He was in charge of the common fund and would help himself to it.

So Jesus replied, "Leave her alone! She did this in preparation for my burial. You have poor people with you always. But you won't always have me."

Members are encouraged to move around the sanctuary to greet each with a hearty handshake or a hug.







It is indeed right and joyful to lift our voices in praise to you, loving God! You answer fear with grace and encourage our wayward steps toward home. You make yourself present to all of creation, so your Spirit can work through us to help mend the broken, bring justice to the excluded, and welcome the forgotten.

You hold us in every sorrow, and bring us comfort and companions even in the shadow of death. All your creatures behold your works, and join to sing your steadfast love:



Now, O God, we remember Jesus. He fasted and prayed; he was tempted and tried. His commitment to follow your way led the powers of this world to put him on a cross. Yet human hands cannot destroy your love. You brought him to new life. He lives even now, our healer and friend. He loved us well, loved us to the end, and loves us still.

Whoever you are, from wherever you come, whatever you believe, you are welcome and invited to receive. Come! For all things are now ready.


Please be seated


Prayer of Thanksgiving


