



WE PROCLAIM THE WORD

Reading

2 Thessalonians 2:1-5, 13-17

(New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition, inclusivized)
A reading from the second letter to the early church at Thessalonica

As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. Let no one deceive you in any way, for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. This is the Enemy, the one who claims to be so much greater than what people call "God," greater than every object of worship -- so much so that it enthrones itself in God's sanctuary and claims to be God. Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you?

We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. For this purpose God called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter.

Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and our Abba God, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word.

May we open ourselves to what the Spirit is saying to the church. Amen.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus and asked him a question: "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her."

Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage, but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed, they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Sarah and Abraham, the God of Rebecca and Isaac, and the God of Leah and Rachel and Jacob. God is God not of the dead, but of the living, for to God all of them are alive."

If you do not wish close contact, offer a sign of blessing to others to let them know you are more comfortable greeting them from a distance.


WE SHARE HOLY COMMUNION

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.


