- Whenever the cross is carried in procession through the congregation, we turn to face the cross to signify our way of life as followers of Jesus.



A reading from the prophet Isaiah

[God said these words through Isaiah to the people of Judea, who had returned from sixty years of exile in Babylon]

"Pay close attention now:

I'm creating new heavens and a new earth.

All the earlier troubles, chaos, and pain are things of the past, to be forgotten.

Look ahead with joy.

Anticipate what I'm creating:

I'll create Jerusalem as sheer joy, create my people as pure delight.

I'll take joy in Jerusalem,

no cries of anguish;



#### Gospel

**Luke 21:5-19** (The Message, inclusivized)

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

One day people were standing around talking about the Temple, remarking how beautiful it was, the splendor of its stonework and memorial gifts. Jesus said, "All this you're admiring so much—the time is coming when every stone in that building will end up in a heap of rubble."

They asked him, "Teacher, when is this going to happen? What clue will we get that it's about to take place?"

He said, "Watch out for the doomsday deceivers. Many leaders are going to show up with forged identities claiming, 'I'm the One,' or, 'The end is near.' Don't fall for any of that. When you hear of wars and uprisings, keep your head and don't panic. This is routine history and no sign of the end."

He went on, "Nation will fight nation and ruler fight ruler, over and over. Huge earthquakes will occur in various places. There will be famines. You'll think at times that the very sky is falling.

"But before any of this happens, they'll arrest you, hunt you down, and drag you to court and jail. It will go from bad to worse, dog-eat-dog, everyone at your throat because you carry my name. You'll end up on the witness stand, called to testify. Make up your mind right now not to worry about it. I'll give you the words and wisdom that will reduce all your accusers to stammers and stutters.

"You'll even be turned in by parents, siblings, relatives, and friends. Some of you will be killed. There's no telling who will hate you because of me. Even so, every detail of your body and soul—even the hairs of your head!—is in my care; nothing of you will be lost. Staying with it—that's what is required. Stay with it to the end. You won't be sorry; you'll be saved."

#### **Spoken Reflection**

#### THE IMPOSSIBLE WILL TAKE A LITTLE WHILE

"Our locating ourselves with those who have been endlessly excluded becomes an act of visible protest. For no amount of our screaming at the people in charge can change them. The margins don't get erased by simply insisting that the powers that be erase them. The trickle-down theory doesn't really work here. The powers bent on waging war against the poor and young and "other" will only be moved to kinship when they see it. Only when we can see a community where all that is excluded is valued and appreciated, will we abandon the values that seek to exclude."

Father Greg Boyle, Founder of Homeboy Industries, which has helped thousands of gang members in Los Angeles imagine they could leave their violent pasts behind and create new heavens and a new earth here and now.

If you do not wish close contact, offer a sign of blessing to others to let them know you are more comfortable greeting them from a distance.




#### **WE SHARE HOLY COMMUNION**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


#### It is right to give our thanks and praise.




# **Prayer of Thanksgiving**
