In Preparation for Worship


- Within the sanctuary please remember that some people use this time of silence to prepare for worship.





The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

When the crowd [following Jesus to] the place [of crucifixion] called Skull Hill, the Roman soldiers crucified Jesus, along with two criminals, one on his right, the other on his left.

Jesus prayed, "Abba God, forgive them; they don't know what they're doing."

Dividing up his clothes, the soldiers threw dice for them. The people stood there staring at Jesus, and the ringleaders made faces, taunting, "He saved others. Let's see him save himself! The Messiah of God—ha! The Chosen—ha!"

The soldiers also came up and poked fun at him, making a game of it. They toasted him with sour wine: "So you're King of the Jews! Save yourself!" Printed over him was a sign: this is the king of the jews.

One of the criminals hanging alongside cursed him: "Some Messiah you are! Save yourself! Save us!"

But the other one made him shut up: "Have you no fear of God? You're getting the same as him. We deserve this, but not him—he did nothing to deserve this."

Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you enter your kingdom." He said, "Don't worry, I will. Today you will join me in paradise."


If you do not wish close contact, offer a sign of blessing to others to let them know you are more comfortable greeting them from a distance.

In body or spirit, please stand



Great Thanksgiving




God, you are before all things; you are beyond all things; and in the midst of all things and all peoples you have made yourself known.


